Title: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit"

Text: Luke 23:46 Date: April 2, 2023

Introduction: Of all the fears that trouble the heart of people, perhaps none is greater than the fear of death. All of our fears can be rolled up into this greatest fear—we are afraid to die. We fear death because it is so final. We fear death because we are not sure what happens when we die. We fear death because it means leaving the world we know for another world we know nothing about.

Individuals will do anything to keep from thinking about death. They will drink themselves into a stupor rather than face the reality of their own mortality. They race through life going 1,000 miles an hour, rushing from one thing to another in a desperate attempt to keep their mind off the inevitable. The Word of God records "Just as people are destined to die once, and after that to face the judgment" (Hebrews 9:27). Therefore, all people would be wise to prepare for this certain event. Individuals are not really prepared to live unless they are prepared to die.

As Christians, we are indeed prepared to die. We have confidence and should not worry about death. Jesus' seventh and final statement from the cross tells us about death and how He died. "Jesus called out with a loud voice" (Jesus recited Psalm 31:5 and simply added the word Father) "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit. When he had said this, he breathed his last" (Luke 23:46).

Let's notice four characteristics of His death which should encourage us and take away any fear of death.

I. Jesus Died Literally

II. Jesus Died Confidently

III. Jesus Died Willingly

IV. Jesus Died Victoriously
