

## SERMON REVIEW

## **“Where Is The Lost And Found” (2 Kings 22)**

Last week Senior Pastor Richard Burguet asked us to imagine: What would we do to make a difference in the world if were an eight-year-old king like Josiah? After the reign of two evil kings—Manasseh and Amon—Josiah became king of Judah. He reigned 31 years, did right in the eyes of the Lord, walked in the way of his father David, and led Judah into a real and effective reformation (see 2 Chronicles 34). It was a slow but effective process. Serving much like a second Moses, Josiah began to seek the God of his father David at age 16; at age 20 he began to purge Judah and Jerusalem of the high places, the altars of the Baal worshippers, the Asherah poles, carved idols, and cast images; and at age 26 began to repair and renovate the temple, which had become a place of pagan worship because of the people's idolatry. During the renovation, the Book of the Law (Deuteronomy), which taught the blessings of obedience to God, was found. Josiah had his secretary, Shaphan, read it to the people in his presence and was humbled to the point of obedience. Josiah valued God's Word, tore his robes, and took spiritual leadership of Judah. He had Shaphan inquire of God what the Word meant and learned that God's forthcoming judgment of Judah would be withheld during his reign. Again, Josiah was humbled and his heart made pliable by God's Word. How are we impacted? As we enter 2026, our New Year's resolutions should be committed to prizes God's Word and making it of utmost value in our lives and hearts. Don't ignore it, neglect it, take it for granted, or let it become "a famine of hearing the words of the Lord" (Amos 8:11). It's also important that we respond appropriately to God's Word. No matter your age, that would make a big difference in the world.
