

SERMON REVIEW

"Prayer &The Terror Of The Night" (2 Kings 19:1-37)

As an introduction to last week's text, Senior Pastor Richard Burguet said the recent 1000-year storm we experienced was an example of the God-appointed storms in our lives that are all part of his plan and purpose. In the text, the thunderclouds of Assyria were threatening to attack Hezekiah and Jerusalem. Even though the distressful situation seemed hopeless, Hezekiah was bold and hopeful because he had the weapon of heartfelt prayer to a sovereign and all-powerful God who does whatever he wants in accordance with his plan and purpose. Hezekiah set a great example for us because he was jealous for the glory of God and knew God was greater than the situation he was facing. He knew prayer was a means of God's grace. God is always glorified when our prayer is about his power and sovereignty and not about ourselves or our inconveniences that will only hinder our desires of them being achieved. Despite threats by Assyrian spokesman Sennacherib (see Isaiah 36), God responds to his insults and accusations by taunting him, telling him who he is, what he has done, and what he will do in accordance with prophecy. God answered Hezekiah's prayer by taking action and delivering Hezekiah, Jerusalem and his people (see Isaiah 37). In a supernatural event, God has 185,000 Assyrians put to death and causes Sennacherib to withdraw in shame and disgrace and return to his country where he is assassinated. God hears our prayers and is faithful and will answer them in his time and in accordance with his plan and purpose. Prayer always begins in hopelessness. Yet God is never surprised by the threats we face. He is bigger than they are because nothing is outside of his perfect plan and will.
