The Greatest Gift- Celebrate God is with us. Matthew 1:23

Bible- Dec 3- Luke 1:5-25, 57-66 God hears our prayers, so we trust His timing

Read: Luke 1:5-25, 57-66

In This Passage: Throughout his life, Zechariah and his wife, Elizabeth, have prayed for a son. Now that they're old, God tells Zechariah he will answer their prayers. Zechariah has a hard time believing God, but God gives them a son in just the right time for his plan.

You'll Be Teaching: God hears our prayers. Younger kids often pray in earnest faith, never doubting God will answer. But at some point in their childhood, doubt can creep in. Prayer is no longer a first response, but a last resort. Kids see that God doesn't always answer their prayers the way they want, so they think he's not listening at all. Help kids see that God's answers to prayer may look very different than we expect, but he's never too late and he's never wrong.

Think About: What's something you prayed about for a really long time? How can you see God at work—even if he didn't answer in the way you expected?

Dig In to Prayer: Pray that kids would trust God to answer their prayers in the best way possible.

Quick Tip: You may expect a lesson on prayer to be primarily reflective and quiet. But it doesn't have to be that way! In this lesson, you'll find time for quiet, reflective prayer...but you'll also see a lot of meaningful action and motion. This enables kids to learn an important lesson without losing focus, as they have frequent opportunity to get some energy out in a productive way.
