SOCIAL TIME

**The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.**

- This month you have Decorate a Tree and Find Baby Jesus.
- You will also find 2 Social activities each week. *\*\*Use one now and one at the end to redirect attention.*

### Games and Music (10 minutes)

**What You Need:** Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games, Assorted colored paper (4 per group), Adult scissors (1 per group), Gift bag (1 per group), Painter's tape (1 per group)

#### What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

**Say:** That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

**Bible Story - Say This!**

Thank you, Super Crew! Today we have learned that God gives us strength. In our Bible story, an angel told Mary she would have a special Baby named Jesus. He would be great because He is God's Son. Mary and Joseph needed God's strength to believe what the angel said and to do what God said to do.

Our Super Clue is a gingerbread house. A gingerbread house needs icing to hold it up and keep it standing strong. God gave Mary and Joseph strength to trust Him and do what He said to do. God gives us strength to stand strong and follow Him too.

*Let's talk and listen to God. This is called prayer. We can thank God for giving us strength.*

*God, thank You for always being with us. Thank You for giving us the strength to follow You. Amen.*

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Best Gift Ever! *(Take a present and pretend to push it forward.)*

God Is Always with Me! *(Reach up with both hands open, pointing inward. Bring them down to your chest.)*

**Bible Story Video (10 minutes)****Decorate A Gingerbread Boy/Girl Ornament — (20 minutes)**

**Big Goal:** Remember what is super about the Super Clue.

**Supplies:** Gingerbread Cutout (1 per kid), markers, candy stickers, ribbon (1 12-inch piece per kid threaded through ornament and tied), Ornament Tag (print on cardstock, cutout, hole punch, 1 tag per kid)

**Craft Instructions:**

1. Before the session, tie a ribbon on each cutout.
2. Give each child a gingerbread cutout, markers, and candy stickers.
3. Invite preschoolers to color their cutout to look like them. They can add candy stickers to make it festive.
4. Add the ornament tag to each ornament and write the kid's name on the tag.

**What To Do:** Our Super Clue today is a gingerbread house. What is our Super Clue? (A gingerbread house!) Way to go! Let's make a fun craft to help us remember our Super Clue. For this craft, you will get a gingerbread cutout. Then you will get some candy stickers to stick on your gingerbread person. You can decorate your gingerbread cutout with markers or crayons and also add stickers and adhesive gems. Are you ready to get started? If you are ready, say, "Let's go!" Ready? (Let's go!) Good!

**Loud And Clear:** Your gingerbread people look amazing! I wonder what is so super about our Super Clue. Let's all ask, "What makes it super?" Ready? "What makes it super?" I am so glad you asked. A gingerbread house needs icing to hold it up and keep it standing strong. If you do not have icing, the roof and walls will fall down. The icing makes it strong, and it also keeps all the candies on it. The same thing is true when you decorate Gingerbread People cookies. The icing holds everything together. Today we are talking about how God gives us strength. God gives us strength to stand strong and follow Him. He gives us strength to believe what He says and do what He tells us to. That is very super!

## TALK IT OUT

### Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? *(a gingerbread house)*
- What does a gingerbread house help us remember? *(A gingerbread house needs icing to hold it up and keep it standing strong. God gives us strength to stand strong and follow Him.)*
- Who did God give strength to in our Bible story? *(Mary and Joseph)*
- **God gives me strength.** What does *God gives me strength* mean? *(It means that God helps me believe what He says and do what He tells me to do.)*
- What did you learn about God today?

**Keep It Going:** Say the Big Deal again but leave out a word. See if preschoolers can fill in the missing word.

### Big Deal Motions:

Best Gift Ever! *(Take a present and pretend to push it forward.)*

God Is Always with Me! *(Reach up with both hands open, pointing inward. Bring them down to your chest.)*

God had a very special message for Mary and Joseph. Mary and Joseph needed God's strength to believe what the angel said and to do what God said to do. ## GOING HOME

### Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
