SOCIAL TIME

The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.

- This month you have Sensory Boxes and Cutting Cutter Fishing.
- You will also find 2 Social activities each week. ***Use one now and one at the end to redirect attention.*

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story - Say This!

Thanks, Super Crew! Our Bible story was about how Jesus healed ten men with a skin disease. One of the men came back to thank Jesus for healing him. He celebrated what God had done. The man fell down at Jesus' feet and thanked Him. Jesus showed how He is good and kind by taking care of these men and healing them. God is always good and kind. Our Super Clue is a kindness card. We can show kindness by giving a friend a kindness card. Jesus shows kindness to us, just like He did to the men in the story. God is always good. This means that God is always kind and takes care of us all the time. He never stops caring for us.

Let's talk and listen to God. This is called prayer. Ready? Let's pray in 3-2-1.

God, thank You for always being good. Thank You for taking care of us. Thank You for the story of the ten lepers and how it teaches us about Your kindness. In Jesus' name, amen.

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Every Day and Every Way! *(Present your right hand with palm up, then your left hand with palm up.)*

God Takes Care of Me! *(Hug arms across your chest.)*

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Fingerprint Fun

Big Goal: Remember the Bible story.

Leader Prep: Print "Fingerprint Fun" labels, one per child. Make a sample craft.

Supplies: "Fingerprint Fun" printable (several), Labels (address labels, 30 per page, #5160) (1 per child), Copy paper (1 per child), Washable ink pads (several), Baby wipes (several), Markers (several)

Craft Instructions:

1. Before the session, print "Fingerprint Fun" labels, one per child. Make a sample craft.
2. Instruct preschoolers to gently press one finger on the ink pad and then on the paper. Guide each child to do this 10 times to represent the 10 lepers.
3. Assist preschoolers in gently pressing their thumb on the ink pad and then on the paper to represent Jesus.
4. Provide baby wipes for preschoolers to clean their fingers.
5. Give each child a label to add to the picture.
6. If time permits, ask preschoolers to draw a smiley face on each of the fingerprints.

What To Do: In today's Bible story, we learned about how Jesus healed ten lepers. Let's count to ten together. Ready? "1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10!" Great job! We are going to create fingerprint artwork and make a craft called "Fingerprint Fun." What is it called? *(Fingerprint Fun!)* Good job! Our craft will help us retell today's Bible story to our family and friends. You are going to make each of the lepers, the men who were sick, by placing your finger on an ink pad and stamping it to the paper. First, you will make 10 fingerprints because there were 10 lepers. Then you will make one more thumbprint for Jesus! *(Show sample craft.)* Are you ready to get started? Let's do it!

Keep It Going: Ask preschoolers to retell the Bible story using their fingerprint artwork. Talk to preschoolers about how each person's fingerprints are unique to them. Let them compare with each other to see that God makes all of us special and unique.

Leader Tip: Carefully monitor and assist preschoolers while they are making their artwork. Guide fingers to the page for those needing assistance.

Loud And Clear: Let's hold up our pictures so we can all see them. *(Allow responses.)* Wow! These are great! This craft will help us remember today's Bible story. In our Bible story, Jesus healed and took care of the lepers, the men who were sick. Jesus took care of the lepers because He is good. One man came back to tell Jesus he was thankful. Jesus told the man that his faith had saved him. The man was cured of his sickness and because of his faith, he also had a friendship with God..

TALK IT OUT

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? (*a kindness card*)
- What does a kindness card help us remember? (*A kindness card is a way to show someone we care about them. A kindness card reminds us that God cares for people and takes care of them.*)
- How many lepers came back to tell Jesus thank you for healing them? (*only one*)
- **God is always good.** How does God show He is good to us each day? (*God takes care of us every day and in every way!*)
- What did you learn about God today?

Keep It Going: Reinforce the Big Deal by asking preschoolers to name times during their day when God takes care of them. Remind preschoolers that God is always taking care of them, no matter the time of day.

Big Deal Motions:

Every Day and Every Way! (Present your right hand with palm up, then your left hand with palm up.)

God Takes Care of Me! (Hug arms across your chest.)

Jesus healed the lepers because He is good and kind. Today we have learned that **God is always good.** Every day and in every way, God is good, and He takes care of us.

GOING HOME

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
