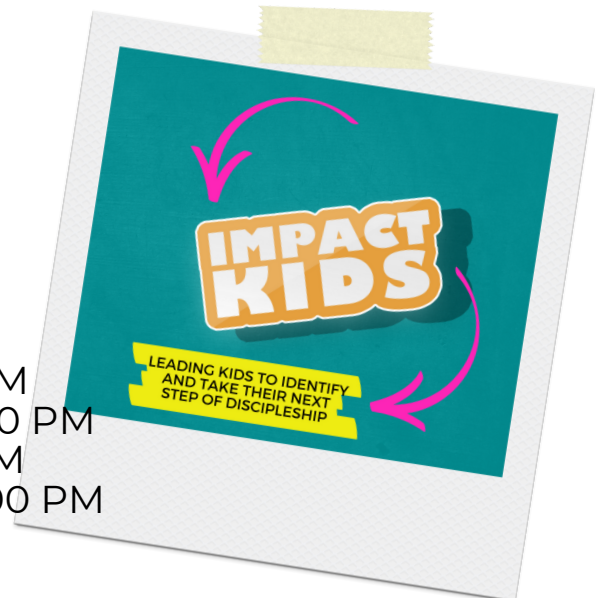

Low Energy Game:

Supplies:

- Amen Sticker (1 per kid)
- Sheet of paper (1 per kid)
- bucket or collapsible laundry bin (1 per group)
- Set of markers

Setup- Open laundry bin and place it at one end of your room, maybe elevated a bit such as on top of a table.

How to Play:

Say: Today, we learned why we often say “amen” at the end of the prayer. We use it as a way to send off our thoughts and release them into God’s hands. Now we’ll do an activity where we’ll send off our prayer- literally!

- Give each kid a sheet of paper and place the markers where they can access them.
- Kids draw or write a prayer they want to send off to God.
- Encourage kids to think about themselves, their friends, their families, etc.
- Offer some topics if anyone seems stuck: health, help with a struggle, a prayer of thanks for something that’s going well, a prayer of praise for something you love about God, etc.
- When kids are finished, they crumple or fold up their prayer however they’d like. Could be a tiny ball, an airplane, a carefully folded triangle- however they choose.
- Give students an Amen sticker to stamp onto the outside of their crumpled/folded prayer to keep if they want it as a reminder.
- On your word, kids throw their prayer into the bin at the opposite end of the room.

Kids can throw individually or at the same time. Reset and continue until all papers are in the bin.

- Pray together to close out the activity. Can be a simple, “God we trust You with our prayers. We know You hear us. We give these prayers to You. Amen.”

Discuss and Watch - The Loop Show- Amen

Today we get to answer a question from YOU on the Loop Show. That's right! The Loop Show is responding to a postcard sent in by a fellow Loop student! Let's watch right now!

Deeper Bible:

Supplies

- Bibles- 1 Chronicles 16:36

SAY: God is always listening to our Prayers.

If you were writing a letter to God, what would you include in it?

Let's look up 1 Chronicles 16:36 together in our Bibles.

"Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting!" Then all the people said, "Amen!" and praised the Lord.

What is especially meaningful to you from this Bible verse?

Discussion Questions:

- What stood out to you the most from today's Loop Show? What's one thing you learned?
- What do you think can be challenging for people about praying?
- Where's a great place to go if you want to pray?
- What would you say to a friend if they said, "I don't think God listens to my prayers?"
- What can you do to remind yourself to pray throughout your week? Including at home, school, during activities like sports, etc.?

Life Application:

Supplies:

- Plastic spice jar (1 per kid)
- Praying hands charm (1 per kid)
- Glitter, beads, etc (1 pinch per kid)
- Water- room temperature (fill each bottle $\frac{3}{4}$ full of glue, then add water to fill the bottle, do not fill to top, the mixture will need space to move as a sensory bottle)
- Clear Glue (1/3 cup per kid)
- funnels (Several per group)
- Prayer Sticker (1 per kid)
- Pressure sensitive seal (1 per kid)

Say: Today we are going to make a sensory jar. This is to help you remember to pray. You can use it as a timer or just something to focus on while you spend 2 minutes each day praying. Don't forget to say "Amen!" What does Amen mean? So be it.

Craft Directions: Kids are going to follow each step with you as they put their Sensory Bottle together.

- Give each kid a bottle.
- Then show them how to pour the glue in their bottle.
- They will pour the glue into their sensory bottle.
- Then add the water.
- Then add glitter and praying hands. You can add beads and other plastic trinkets to add visual interest in the bottle. When needed use the funnel to insert the objects.
- Help kids place the pressure sensitive seal on the top of their bottle. Then seal with the lid.
- Kids will put the Prayer sticker on the side of their bottle.

When all the bottles are sealed up and ready.

Ask kids to use their bottles to pray with you. On the count of 3 they will turn their bottles upside down and pray with you.

Pray:

Lord, it's hard to know what to ask You for. I know You want us to ask for what You want so I am asking You right now to give these students wisdom to know what to ask You for. God if we need courage, I ask that You give them courage. If they need joy, I ask that You give them joy. If they need forgiveness, I ask that You give them the strength to ask. We know You want the best for our lives so we ask for Your wisdom to know what that is. Thank You God for listening to us when we talk to You. In Jesus name I pray, Amen."
