SOCIAL TIME

The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.

- This month you have bean bag toss game/matching game and building sets.

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story - Say This!

Wow! Thanks so much, Super Crew! In our Bible story we learned about a sick woman who was healed when she touched Jesus' clothes. Jesus is God's Son, and He knew the moment the woman touched Him and was healed. Jesus knew everything about the woman who was sick, and He cared for her. God is everywhere—He is up, down, and all around. He knows about us and cares about us too.

Our Super Clue is a picture of friends, and it reminds us that just like we know and love our friends, God knows us and loves us too.

Let's talk and listen to God together by praying. Let's thank Him for knowing us and caring about us.

God, thank You so much for knowing every single person. Thank You for knowing our needs, like when we are sick and need help. Thank you for knowing us, caring about us, and loving us very much. Amen.

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Up, Down, All Around! (Place closed fists at head level. Bring them down to your chest. Roll hands over each other in a circular motion.)

God Knows Me! (Tap each side of your temple with your pointer fingers three times.)

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Hand Art(20 minutes)**Big Goal:** Remember the Bible story.**Leader Prep:** Print “Hand Art” labels, one per child. Cut out hearts from tissue paper or construction paper, several per child.**Supplies:** “Hand Art” printable (1 per kid), Construction paper (several), Tissue paper (several), Glue sticks (1 per child), Labels (address labels, 30 per page, #5160) (several), Adult scissors (1 per group), Crayons (several), Markers (several), Heart stickers (several; optional)**Craft Instructions:**

1. Before the session, print “Hand Art” labels, one per child. Cut out hearts from tissue paper or construction paper, several per child. Offer heart-shaped stickers if you prefer not to cut out paper hearts.
2. Give each preschooler a Hand Art Printable. Encourage kids to trace the hand outline on the paper.
3. Give preschoolers several heart-shaped cutouts and a glue stick or heart-shaped stickers.
4. Allow preschoolers to glue the hearts on the paper around their traced hands.
5. Encourage preschoolers to decorate their papers with crayons and a “Hand Art” label placed in the box.

What To Do: We are going to make a craft called “Hand Art.” What is it called? (*Hand Art!*) Yes! You will trace the hand outline on your paper or color it in. Then we will give you several heart-shaped cutouts and a glue stick. You will put glue on the back of each heart and add them all around your handprint by pressing them down on the paper. (*Use heart stickers if you prefer.*) You can add some decorations with crayons and a sticker that says *Jesus Healed a Woman* in the box to remind you of our Bible story.

Leader Tip: If using tissue paper, fold it multiple times before cutting out hearts so you are cutting several out at once. Hearts are easy to cut out by folding the paper in half and cutting out one half of a heart. Have preschoolers spread glue around their traced hands and then stick the tissue hearts on the glue rather than trying to put glue on the tissue paper hearts.

Loud And Clear: Your crafts are so beautiful. They remind me that in our Bible story, a sick woman used her hand to touch Jesus’ clothes for healing. She knew Jesus could heal her, and He did. Jesus could heal her because He is God’s Son. He knew the moment the woman touched Him and was healed. Jesus knew everything about the woman who was sick, and He loved her. God is everywhere—up, down, and all around. And, that means He knows everything about us, and He loves us more than we can ever know. These hearts all around your handprints remind us that God knows us and loves us. Great job!

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? *(a picture of friends)*
- What does a picture of friends help us remember? *(It helps us remember that God knows us and cares about us.)*
- Today we learned that **God knows everyone**. Does God know us and our friends? Does God know our families? *(Yes! **God knows everyone**. God is everywhere—up, down, and all around—and that means He knows everything about us.)*
- In our Bible story, Jesus' friends asked Jesus how He knew who touched His clothes. How did Jesus know who touched His clothes? *(Jesus knows everyone and everything because He is God the Son. He knew the woman who touched His clothes.)*
- Who can you tell that God knows everyone?

Do you remember today's Big Deal? I will say it first, then you say it after me. *(Use the motions below as you say the Big Deal.)* Ready? Up, Down, All Around! *(Up, Down, All Around!)* God Knows Me! *(God Knows Me!)*

Keep It Going: Say the Big Deal using different speeds. Say it fast, then in slow motion.

Big Deal Motions:

Up, Down, All Around! *(Place closed fists at head level. Bring them down to your chest. Roll hands over each other in a circular motion.)*

God Knows Me! *(Tap each side of your temple with your pointer fingers three times.)*

Today we learned that **God knows everyone**. Let's say that together. I will say it first, and you say it after me. Ready? **God knows everyone. (God knows everyone.)** Great job! In our Bible story today, a woman touched Jesus and was healed. Jesus knew her and loved her. He knows and loves us too.

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
