

The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games, music and music player, toy Dr. kit (1 per group), towel or blanket

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story - Say This!

Amazing! Thanks so much, Super Crew! In our Bible story we learned about a man named Job (JOHB). Job was a very good man and kind to everyone, but he had a lot of hurts and troubles. This was very hard for Job to understand, and he was very sad. During his troubles, Job's wife told him that he should curse God and die. But Job answered, "Should we accept only good from God and not trouble?" Job knew that God loved him. He knew that God could be trusted even when he was hurting. There may be times when we feel sad or upset. We can know that God knows when we hurt, and He cares about us. He sees our ups and downs, our good times and our hard times. He knows them all and loves us so much!

Our Super Clue today is a toy doctor kit. When we are playing and pretending, we can use a toy doctor kit to "help" a friend who is hurting. God knows everything about us, even the hurts and hard things that happen. We do not always understand why we hurt, but we can always trust that God knows every hurt, and He is good.

Let's say our Big Deal, "Up, Down, All Around! God Knows Me!" together. Ready? "Up, Down, All Around! God Knows Me!" Great job!

We can talk and listen to God together as we pray. Let's thank God for knowing every hurt we have and for caring about us.

God, thank You so much for knowing every hurt we have. Thank You for even knowing the hurt in our hearts that people cannot see. Thank You for loving and caring about us. We love You. Amen.

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Up, **Down**, **All Around!** (Place closed fists at head level. Bring them down to your chest. Roll hands over each other in a circular motion.)

God Knows Me! (Tap each side of your temple with your pointer fingers three times.)

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Hop on Hearts(20 minutes)

Preschoolers will practice saying the Theme verse while hopping from word to word on printable hearts.

Big Goal: Remember the Theme verse.

Leader Prep: Print and cut out "Hop On Hearts" printable on cardstock, one per group. Laminate or cover with clear contact paper for durability if desired. Tape each heart in a row on the floor.

Supplies: "Hop On Hearts" printable (1 per group), Cardstock (several), Adult scissors (1 per group), Painter's tape (1 per group)

What To Do: This is going to be such a fun way to practice our Theme verse. Take a look at the hearts taped to the ground. We are going to get in a line in front of the first heart and jump to each one as we say the Theme verse. Let's start by practicing the verse all together. Ready? I will say it first, and you can say it after me.

The Lord sees the heart. (The Lord sees the heart.)
1 Samuel 16:7c (1 Samuel 16:7c)

Awesome! Now we are ready to hop on the hearts as we say the Theme verse. I will go first! (Hop to each heart while saying each word of the verse.) Now it is your turn! (Assist preschoolers in remembering the words of the Theme verse. If needed, say each word for preschoolers to repeat.)

Loud And Clear: Wow! You really remembered this Bible verse. This is a good verse to remember because it tells us that God does not just see how we look on the outside, but He also sees our hearts—the things we feel and think. Sometimes we have hurts, and God knows about them. God knows when our bodies hurt and when our hearts are hurting. When our hearts are hurting, we might feel alone, sad, or mad. God sees our hearts, knows what we feel, and He cares about us.

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? (a toy doctor kit)
- What does a toy doctor kit help us remember? (We can use a toy doctor kit to "help" a friend who is hurting. God knows everything about us, even the hurts and hard things that happen.)
- Today we learned that **God knows every hurt.** Does God know our hurts, even the ones in our hearts? (Yes! God knows every hurt—the ones on our body, our physical hurts, and the hurts in our hearts, hurts in our emotions and feelings.)
- How can we encourage our friends who are hurting? (Answers will vary. We can tell our friends they are doing a good job, Jesus loves them, we care about them, and so on.)
- What did you learn about God today?

Do you remember today's Big Deal? I will say it first, then you say it after me. (Use the motions below as you say the Big Deal.) Ready? Up, Down, All Around! (Up, Down, All Around!) God Knows Me! (God Knows Me!)

Keep It Going: Say the Big Deal using different speeds. Say it fast, then in slow motion.

Big Deal Motions:

Up, Down, All Around! (Place closed fists at head level. Bring them down to your chest. Roll hands over each other in a circular motion.)

God Knows Me! (Tap each side of your temple with your pointer fingers three times.)

Job had a lot of hurts and troubles. It was hard for him to understand why these things were happening to him. But God knew Job, just like God knows every one of us. God spoke to Job. He cared about Job's hurts, and He cares about your hurts too.

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
 As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
