Recently, I found myself humming one of my favorite hymns from our hymnal, "The Faith We Sing" and then singing it to myself: "For everyone born, a place at the table." That got me thinking on the last weekend in May. And I stumbled across the following passage from the Bible:

"13 But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. 14 And you will be blessed because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Luke 14:13-14 (NRSV)

Jesus never threw a potluck without also flipping the seating chart. Time and again in the Gospels, meals become the setting where Jesus tears down barriers—between rich and poor, insider and outsider, "clean" and "unclean."

In Luke 14, He reminds us that the kingdom of God isn't about upward mobility or social status. It's about welcome. It's about creating a table where those who are overlooked and under-invited find a place not just to eat, but to belong.

Hospitality in the kingdom is never transactional. Jesus says to invite those who can't pay us back—not because it's noble, but because it's **normal** in His upside-down way of living. Feeding the hungry isn't charity. It's family. It's kingdom culture. And it invites us to

go beyond just handing out bread, toward building relationships rooted in dignity and shared humanity.

Our hymn For Everyone Born puts it beautifully: For everyone born, a place at the table... a shelter, a space, a safe place for growing... and God will delight when we are creators of justice and joy, compassion and peace...

From 9:30 AM to 4 PM, ten dedicated volunteers took turns sharing smiles, information, and even a little healthy competition with the Cheney community. This year, our table had a little something for everyone: flyers about our church, copies of our latest newsletter, and some very cool Cheney UMC tote bags. But the real showstopper? #### Worship in a Galaxy Not So Far Away - A Star Wars experience

You were exactly where the Force meant for you to be: Cheney United Methodist Church, for not one but *two* epic Star Wars-themed worship services!

## Episode I: May the 4th – "May the Light Be With You"

From the moment Pastor Damian welcomed us as "Rebels of the Light," the tone was set. Our sanctuary was alive with music, laughter, trivia, and yes—costumes. We explored how God's love, like the Force, surrounds us, guides us, and can be trusted even in the dusty, Tatooine-ish moments of our lives.

Luke Skywalker's transformation became our metaphor: slow down, unlearn fear, and trust the light already within you. I'm pretty sure even Yoda would've shed a tear.

#### Episode II: May 11th - "The Gospel Strikes Back" (Mother's Day Edition!)

This service turned to Darth Vader's story—and how even the hardest hearts can be redeemed. We saw how the Dark Side often starts with wounds, not wickedness. Pastor Damian reminded us that the Gospel doesn't shame us into the light—it loves us out of the dark. And judging by the glow sticks lighting up the sanctuary during prayer, we're all a little more ready to fight fear with faith.

If you missed these services, I'm so sorry... but also, HOW DARE YOU!? Just kidding. But seriously—these two Sundays weren't just cute theme days. They were deeply meaningful. We're planning something more than just sermons. Think interactive experiences, themed events, and meaningful conversations that start with film and lead to faith. But we need your help to make it happen.


Join us for our next planning meeting on Tuesday, June 3 at 5:30 PM.
