What would Jesus watch?

"And the Word became flesh and lived among us..." - John 1:14 (NRSV)

Have you ever wondered what Jesus would be like if he showed up today? Not in ancient robes, but in sneakers and a hoodie. Would he be hanging out on TikTok? Would he shop at Costco? And here's a real question: Would Jesus watch Netflix (or HBO or HULU...)? It might sound silly at first—but it's actually deeply theological. Because Christianity is not about a distant God who stays far away from our world. It's about a God who became human. Who lived, laughed, cried, ate, and walked among people. Jesus met folks where they were—at wells, weddings, dinner tables, on boats, and street corners.

So... if Jesus walked into our world today, maybe he wouldn't preach from a boat—maybe he'd ask, "Can we talk after this episode?"

But what would he watch?

1. He'd probably start with The Chosen

Just to see how people have interpreted his life. He might chuckle, maybe cringe at a few lines, but he'd be proud that people are still trying to tell the story.

2. He'd watch shows like Heartstopper or Sex Education

Not for scandal, but for compassion. Jesus always had time for those figuring out who they are, especially if they felt judged or excluded. He listened, healed, embraced.

3. He'd enjoy The Good Place

He might laugh at the point system for getting into heaven and say, "Interesting idea—but I offer grace, not a scoreboard."

4. He'd be drawn to documentaries

Stories of injustice, racism, poverty, migration. Why? Because those are the places he always went. Where pain is, Jesus shows

5. And yes—Jesus would laugh

He might binge an episode of *Ted Lasso* or *Friends*. Why? Because joy matters. Because laughter heals. Because grace is funny. So maybe the better question isn't, "Would Jesus watch Netflix?" Maybe it's:

A Joyful Leap of Faith - Outdoor Service & New Members





A Fresh Way to Connect and Grow in Faith

As we get ready for our upcoming **movie series**, we're excited about the chance to welcome new people into our church community—folks who may be curious about faith, looking for connection, or just exploring what it means to follow Jesus.

That's why I am planning a **new Bible Study**, designed especially for people who have difficulties reading and understanding the Bible (so we will do some reflection on "What is the Bible? How to read the Bible...) and for people who haven't been part of a study group before. Whether you come because of the movie series or have just been waiting for the right time—**this is for you**.

One of our church volunteers, who's been with us for about 1.5 years, recently asked if we could offer an **evening Bible Study**, since not everyone can make it to the Thursday daytime group. So—we're making it happen!

This study will focus on the **basics of our Christian faith**—a great starting point whether you're brand new or just want a refresher. Ronda Cordill and Cecille Corsilles-Sy from Beacon Hill UMC teamed up on a 10-day mission to work with Missionary Joy Prim and the Domestic Migrant Workers in Hong Kong. The workers are often considered modern-day slaves working 24 hours a day for at least 6 days per week. They cook, clean, care for children or elderly parents and do any other chores required of them by their employers. They are very



stressed leaving their families (mainly from the Philippines), working to support them from Hong Kong. Their access to any physical or mental health care is limited. The Methodist International Church in Hong Kong Pastor, Rev Israel Bangsil who serves in Hong Kong from the Philippines reports that more than 20 women from his congregations have commit suicide over the past 4 years. Stress leading to anxiety and depression seems to be very common cause of these deaths.

Cecille and I worked on two pilot programs in a variety of settings to identify illnesses and ways to get services or help so they do not feel they need to such drastic measures are suicide. Cecille presented workshops on the Community Resiliency Model (CRM) which teaches wellness skills, focusing on the well-being in mind, body, and spirit. We are working with the community to teach and train others in these mental health skills.



Ronda presented several workshops on chronic health conditions such as diabetes and hypertension and when to go to the doctor.

June is a very hot month and most of the workshops were done on the street in 90 degree/100% humidity but the weather did not diminish the numbers who attended. The plan is to continue to train the migrants to teach others

with the CRM skills and Ronda is working to find local partners to help provide more health awareness and resources to help the migrants get healthcare.

Joy Prim, who Cheney UMC support, has been very busy working on issues of migrant slavery worldwide. She traveled to Rome for the World Council of Churches meeting on

Migrants and then to the Philippines to be part of UMC discussions on Migrants. I will share more information in this newsletter about her work in the future.

Another Mission is being planned for early 2026. If you would like to be part of the mission let Ronda Cordill know. Thank you for all of your support of this mission. Blessings, Ronda
