

"Wait... We Have Social Principles?"

Did you know the United Methodist Church has something called the *Social Principles*? If that phrase makes you raise your eyebrows a little, you're not alone. I didn't discover them until I was already well into my faith journey as a Methodist and I can't stop talking about them. Why? Because they are, in many ways, one of the best-kept treasures of our denomination. And here's some really exciting news: as of 2024, we now have a *brand-new revised version* — created, prayed over, and voted on by United Methodists from all over the globe. Yes, really, this isn't just a U.S. thing. These updated Social Principles have been affirmed by delegates from Europe, Africa, the U.S., the Philippines, and beyond. I honestly don't know of another global church that has something quite like this: a shared, thoughtful, worldwide reflection on what it means to live faithfully in the world today.

The Social Principles aren't rules. They're not requirements. **They are a spiritual and moral compass** offering reflections and affirmations on how we as Christians (specifically as United Methodists) might engage with the economic, social, and political realities of our time. (That's actually how they're organized: *The Economic Community, The Social Community,* and *The Political Community.*). Some of the topics might surprise you. There's a section on creation care. On human rights. On healthcare, peace, the use of power, and yes, even gun violence. And each one is grounded in our calling to follow Jesus in real, everyday life.

One section that especially speaks to me and maybe it will to you, too, is the part that affirms *single people*. As someone who has been single for quite a while now, I'm all too familiar with the awkward comments or assumptions that come along with that. Sometimes it feels like sin-

gleness is treated like a problem to be solved; like you're somehow less whole until you're part of a couple. But the Social Principles say something radically different. They say:

"We celebrate the contributions of single people and reject all social practices that discriminate against them or subject them to bias and prejudice. We respect the decisions of single people regarding marriage and we affirm the many ways in which they may participate in family and community life. This profound sense of respect extends to single parents. We recognize the extra burdens and challenges that single parenthood entails and offer our love, support, and care in the fulfillment of this special vocation." Isn't that beautiful?



After the Silmarillion we are going to read the Hobbit.


Unmasking Christian Nationalism

As followers of Christ, we are called to name those distortions and live out a better way: the way of liberation, reconciliation, and hope.

That's why we're gathering for **Unmasking Christian Nationalism**, a three-part event series at Eastern Washington University. Each evening will feature a nationally recognized voice who will challenge, inspire, and equip us to think faithfully and respond courageously. Whether you are a student, community member, person of faith, or someone simply curious about how religion shapes public life, you are welcome.
