

DEFINITION OF BIBLICAL THEOLOGY

Biblical Theology is the **approach/discipline/framework** of reading and understanding the Bible and its parts as **one** coherent and cohesive story written by **One** Divine Author.

THE STORY (HEART) OF THE BIBLE

The Bible is God communicating to us the story of who He is and how He acts to redeem and reign over His people for their great joy and His great glory.



HOW TO READ THE BIBLE

When we read the Bible we must read it as **God-centered** not man-centered.

We should read every part of the Bible in light of the **gospel of Jesus** and **the glory of God**.

Why Biblical Theology is Important

Biblical theology helps us to read, understand, interpret, and apply the Bible rightly.

If you don't understand the whole story, you'll miss the point of the parts.
