In Adult Forum, there begins a 5-session look at the valuable concepts expressed in a book entitled **Sabbath as Resistance: Saying NO to the Culture of Now**, written by theologian and Old Testament scholar, Walter Brueggemann. The author addresses our 24/7 society in which we live to achieve, accomplish, perform and possess. We'll explore together how keeping the Sabbath allows us to break this restless cycle and focus on what is truly important: God, other people, all of life. Sabbath is not simply about keeping rules but about becoming a whole person and restoring a whole society. Grab a cup of coffee and join the conversation. The conversation promises to be of value even if one can not attend all 5 sessions. Reading the book is not required to participate in the conversation. Daybreak Shelter (500 Don Hovey Drive) and Men's Resale Shop (2102 N. Calumet Ave.) support our unhoused neighbors in Valparaiso – Daybreak's vision is that one day there will be a home for every unhoused individual within the City. Daybreak offers a 24-bed primary shelter for men, a co-ed overnight warming/cooling shelter, and a day center where individuals can receive case management and support as they work toward

attaining housing. See Daybreak's webpage for volunteer signups to volunteer to prepare and/or serve a dinner at Daybreak. The Resale Shop is always in need of donated furniture and appliances. Gabriel's Horn in South Haven/Portage (792 McCool Road) is a Shelter for Homeless Women and Children. The short term shelter with supportive services include an aftercare program, arts & crafts classes, counseling, case management, and transportation. The Shelter helps lives rebuild, return to independence, and find dignity and hope – together creating a supportive


Attention All CLC Musicians

CLC ENDOWMENT CORNER...

"Give it your all." You've probably heard that from a coach, mentor or loved one sometime in your life. But when it comes to planning your estate, you don't have to take an all-or-nothing approach.

You may have many people and causes you love—and wonder how you can possibly take care of them all after

Adding or changing beneficiaries for accounts such as IRAs or life insurance is as simple as filling out a paper or online form.

One more advantage of giving percentages of your estate: Your gift automatically adjusts in proportion to the size of your estate. That means that each beneficiary's share will remain aligned with your intentions no matter what.

Upcoming dates are November 12 and 26; December 10 and 31; January 14, 2026.


