Daybreak Shelter (500 Don Hovey Drive) and Men's Resale Shop (2102 N. Calumet Ave.) support our unhoused neighbors in Valparaiso – Daybreak's vision is that one day there will be a home for every unhoused individual within the City. Daybreak offers a 24-bed primary shelter for men, a co-ed overnight warming/cooling shelter, and a day center where individuals can receive case management and support as they work toward attaining housing. See Daybreak's webpage for volunteer signups to volunteer to prepare and/or serve a dinner at Daybreak. The Resale Shop is always in need of donated furniture and appliances. Please see a separate announcement in CLC weekly E-News about smaller items needed for donation to Daybreak during the month of November.

Gabriel's Horn in South Haven/Portage (792 McCool Road) is a Shelter for Homeless Women and Children. The short term shelter with supportive services include an aftercare program, arts & crafts classes, counseling, case management, and transportation. The Shelter helps lives rebuild, return to independence, and find dignity and hope – together creating a supportive environment where dreams of stability become reality. Games for Kids at the Crisis Center

This Advent season we are partnering with Bethel Lutheran Church to provide games and puzzles for kids who come to the Crisis Center in Gary, Indiana. The youths who come to the Crisis Center are in need of emergency shelter. This year, the Crisis Center has asked Bethel and CLC to provide games and puzzles – new

or gently used – for the Crisis Center to have available so the kids who are staying temporarily at the center will have fun things to do. The donations are for kids aged 10-20 but most of the kids fall in the age range of 12-17.

The Crisis Center began as a crisis hotline with volunteers in 1971 and has grown to include the Alternative House emergency shelter for children and youth, Safe Place outreach to youth in crisis and Teen Court prevention and early intervention services for youth.

If you'd like to help, please bring your games and puzzles – new or gently used – and leave them on the designated table in the Gathering Place on Sundays from November 30th to December 14th. No need to wrap these donations.
