Lutheran World Relief School Kits

As much as we love summer, school supplies will soon be in the stores. And, as always, we will be collecting for Lutheran World Relief. Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty. Ensuring that girls attend school, especially in places where their access is deprioritized, has even stronger results. Lutheran World Relief School Kits contain essential supplies to help children — and in some cases, adults — continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. That learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.

Our goal this year is to collect enough supplies through early October for 120 kits, each kit containing the following:

FOUR – 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½" (LWR cannot use loose-leaf paper).

ONE – 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.

ONE – pencil sharpener.

ONE – pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well).

FIVE – <u>unsharpened</u> #2 pencils with erasers.

FIVE – black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink).

ONE – box of 16 or 24 crayons.

ONE - 2.5" eraser.

There is a basket in the Gathering Space for donations.

- Celebrated our Little Lamb Preschool students who will be leaving us to move on to kindergarten;
- · Inspired faith, creativity and exploration at our preschool's annual STEAM camp;
- Encouraged our youth to deepen their faith at Lutherwald's confirmation camp and senior high camp;
- Hosted a housing assembly with We Make Indiana, a local non-profit dedicated to making housing more affordable in our local community;
- Enjoyed an evening of fellowship and friendly competition at Trivia Night, which raised \$1,466 for our youth program;
- Continued to support a refugee family from Venezuela as they acclimate to life in Valparaiso;
- Rejoiced on Easter morning with shouts of "Alleluia!" and sounds of keys jingling, bells ringing, voices singing, and many instruments raising their songs to our risen Lord;
- Worshipped as one congregation at our combined summer worship services;
- Enjoyed fellowship with one another at a summer potluck after worship;
- Recognized and celebrated the accomplishments of our congregation's graduates and retirees as they
 move on to new adventures;
- Enriched our worship with beautiful artwork in our Gathering Space depicting the Beatitudes in Art, by artist Jen Norton;
- Introduced CLC Family Faith Gatherings, where all generations come together on a summer evening for food, fellowship, and service;
- Approved our Ministry Plan for the 2025-2026 fiscal year, making a commitment to raise \$924,629 to fund the ministries of this congregation and \$11,400 to repay cash borrowed from our restricted funds;
- Joyfully indicated \$559,694 in generosity though our "Who Is My Neighbor?" stewardship campaign, which supports the operating budget and allows us to continue serving our neighbors all over the world;
- Received a grant from the John W. Anderson Foundation, which will support our operating fund and allow us to complete much-needed property projects;
- Provided meeting space for Alcoholics Anonymous, and Gamblers Anonymous, grief support group, and other groups;
- Continued our commitment to nurture our faith through Sunday School, education hour classes, confirmation, Fusion, Circle, book groups, and Bible studies;
- Raised \$5,327 to share with the ministries of CoAction, Reconciling Works, LGBTQ Outreach of Porter County, Project Neighbors, and Food Bank of Northwest Indiana.

Called Together: Listening, Learning, Living Tuning Our Hearts to One Another, Moving as One

The Indiana-Kentucky Synod is embarking on a journey of listening, learning, and living together, responding to God's call to work with the people of God throughout our territory. Our initiative, *Called Together: Listening, Learning, Living*, invites everyone to join in a shared process of reflection and action. As we listen to God and each other, we will discover how we can work together in faith.

Phase 1: Listening to God's Call Listening across the synod – drawing in diverse stories, needs, and hopes

In this first phase, we focus on listening—not just with our ears but with our hearts. We seek to understand the diverse stories, needs, and hopes of our community and where God is at work throughout the Synod. "Give ear and come to me; hear me, that your soul may live" (Isaiah 55:3).

We invite you to share your story and listen deeply to one another. Everyone's voice is needed, as together we seek to hear God's call.

Phase 2: Learning and Living as One Creating experiments and partnerships based on what's been heard

Once we've listened, it's time to act. In Phase 2, we'll create partnerships and opportunities based on what we've learned. "Just as a body, though one, has many parts... so it is with Christ" (1 Corinthians 12:12-14). Each of us has a unique role, and together, we make up the body of Christ, moving toward our shared purpose.

"Make every e[ort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3). This phase is about living out our shared faith in Jesus with unity, humility, and love. We will work together to create experiments and partnerships that respond to God's call in our lives.

An AMOS https://www.facebook.com/amissionofservice ministry team, including CLC's Gail Mannington (Board member and Treasurer), regularly undertakes Medical Mission trips to South Dakota (Pine Ridge Reservation), in Guatemala (Esquipulas), and in Honduras (Copan). On each trip AMOS provides medical clinics, health care, speech pathology services and education. The next trip,

to Pine Ridge, home of the Oglala Lakota tribe, and in collaboration with the nonprofit Re-Member, is leaving July 25 during Health Care Week.

During each trip the team sees and treats hundreds of patients during clinic days, and the needs are voluminous. AMOS raises funds to purchase and provide prescription medications, ointments, and vitamins, and also collects over-the-counter medications for the mission team to take (CLC members have donated hundreds of pounds of over-the-counter medicines).
