COMMUNION

When finished you may leave individually without being dismissed. **Wine** is received either by Common Cup or from individual glasses in trays. For those requiring it for health reasons, **GRAPE JUICE** is dark and in the center of each tray. **USED GLASSES** are to be placed in the basket located near the ramp. **GLUTEN-FREE BREAD IS AVAILABLE**, please indicate to the server that you require this. Also, if you unable to come up to the altar, let an usher know so that pastor can bring communion to you.

When all have returned to their places, the presiding minister continues.

The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace. **Amen.**
