The Good News February 2024





For the past two years our congregation has been listening, learning, asking and wondering what we mean when we say "Everyone is welcome here." We heard from our beloved youth as they shared their experiences in the LGBTQIA+ community at the high school and around town; our beloved siblings shared about their family, friends, neighbors and coworkers; we have explored and learned how our culture uses pronouns, talks about gender, and more. Together we crafted, revised, and ultimately approved an official Welcome Statement that

proudly proclaims:

We are a community of people sharing God's love through Christ and growing together in faith.

We are delighted to report that our good work has been recognized: we have been named a Partner Congregation in the <u>Reconciling in Christ Program</u>, a "holy ministry of welcome, inclusion, celebration, and advocacy."

The purpose of the Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Program is to ensure the welcome, inclusion, celebration, and advocacy for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions; work for racial equity and commit to anti-racist work and support the national program. Since 1983, the RIC program has been a public way for faith communities to see, name, celebrate, and advocate for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions in the Lutheran church.

As a result of this recognition our congregation is now listed in a searchable national map, which provides people in the LGBTQIA+ community and their allies the ability to search for a faith community in their area. This inclusion in the directory is an important way for us to extend welcome and invitation to the people we have specifically named in our Welcome Statement.

The RIC program notes <u>something we've already experienced</u> during the "Deepening our Welcome" process:

Many RIC partners report the demographic most often drawn in by the RIC status is young couples with children. These folks are seeking communities prepared to help them raise their children in ways consistent with their values. They want their children to grow up surrounded by diversity and to know their families will never have to question if their children will be welcome as they grow and learn more about who they are.

Together we will name and celebrate this milestone in the life of our vibrant, loving, welcoming congregation during worship on February 4, with cake and celebration during the Formation Hour (9:20am). Please be sure to join us for this important step in the life of our congregation.

Social Ministry Emphasis for February is Hilltop House https://www.hilltophouse.org



February's emphasis is to provide monetary and volunteer support for Hilltop House and Hilltop Food Pantry. HH is located "on a hill" in a neighborhood west of Valparaiso U. where social service needs are real for the families and children living there. HH can provide as a health care provider Medicare and Hoosier Healthwise benefits to those in Porter County living below the poverty level (estimated to be 9000 children and 4000 women in Porter County). A gift of \$50 permits Hilltop to provide childcare, health care, and community improvement activities within a child's own family setting (also contributions may qualify for Indiana's Neighborhood Assistance Tax Credit).

Help achieve our goal of \$2500 in February (over and above giving combined with CLC's budgeted amount of \$1200). By achieving our goal CLC will help **Hilltop** continue to thrive. Coming Soon! Faith Formation during Lent (and beyond!)



Join us during the weeks of Lent for the study of The Color of Compromise. This book and video series introduces us to the roots of racial injustice in the American church. This survey will take us on an historical, sociological, and religious journey from the American colonial period right through the Black Lives Matter movement and charts a path forward to replace established patterns and systems of complicity with bold, courageous, immediate action.

The author is Jemar Tisby (BA, University of Notre Dame; MDiv, Reformed Theological Seminary) is President of The Witness: A black Christian Collective, where he writes about race, religion, politics, and culture. He is also cohost of the Pass the Mic podcast and is studying for a PhD in History at the University of Mississippi with a focus on race religion, and social movements in the twentieth century.

This series begins on February 18th at 9:20am in the Church Hall (big room next to the kitchen).

CLC Congregation,

This past month has been filled with many blessings and exciting opportunities for our youth ministries! We have our upcoming Mardi Gras fundraiser (which myself and the youth are SUPER excited for!), the beginning of a new "Theology Club" with some of our high schoolers, and the building of new connections with other churches in the area, among many other things! It has been a busy month for our youth, and as our youth group returned from Quake this past weekend, many of us came back with an important reminder about the need for rest amid this busyness.

The theme of Quake this year, which is a weekend-long youth retreat in Schaumburg, Illinois, was "Breathe." Much of the weekend focused on how amid the busyness of our lives, we are called to find rest in Jesus. The speaker of this year's Quake, who went by the name "Packer" Dave (if you're a Packers fan like I am, I'm sure you'll appreciate that one) spoke a lot about how life brings with it a lot of different obstacles that try to push us down and how this can be very overwhelming for many of us. "Packer" Dave explained that it is in these times that Jesus calls us to bring our worries, stresses, and anxieties to him, as he will provide us with the rest that we need.

Since being back from Quake, I've spent a lot of time reflecting on the busyness of life and how many of us often forget to stop and simply breathe. I once saw a video that talked about how with every breath we take, we are actually breathing in God's name. Each breath we take is a call out to God and so when we take the time to pause, breathe in, and speak God's name through that breath, we are finding our rest through God.

My hope is that if you are feeling the busyness of life in this season, that you are reminded of the rest we can find through God and that there isn't a stress, worry, or burden too heavy for our God to carry. Thanks be to God!


