

# The Good News March 2024





For the past two years our congregation has been listening, learning, asking and wondering what we mean when we say "Everyone is welcome here." We heard from our beloved youth as they shared their experiences in the LGBTQIA+ community at the high school and around town; our beloved siblings shared about their family, friends, neighbors and coworkers; we have explored and learned how our culture uses pronouns, talks about gender, and more. Together we crafted, revised, and ultimately approved an official Welcome Statement that

proudly proclaims:

We are a community of people sharing God's love through Christ and growing together in faith.

We are delighted to report that our good work has been recognized: we have been named a Partner Congregation in the <u>Reconciling in Christ Program</u>, a "holy ministry of welcome, inclusion, celebration, and advocacy."

The purpose of the Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Program is to ensure the welcome, inclusion, celebration, and advocacy for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions; work for racial equity and commit to anti-racist work and support the national program. Since 1983, the RIC program has been a public way for faith communities to see, name, celebrate, and advocate for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions in the Lutheran church.

As a result of this recognition our congregation is now listed in a searchable national map, which provides people in the LGBTQIA+ community and their allies the ability to search for a faith community in their area. This inclusion in the directory is an important way for us to extend welcome and invitation to the people we have specifically named in our Welcome Statement.

The RIC program notes <u>something we've already experienced</u> during the "Deepening our Welcome" process:

Many RIC partners report the demographic most often drawn in by the RIC status is young couples with children. These folks are seeking communities prepared to help them raise their children in ways consistent with their values. They want their children to grow up surrounded by diversity and to know their families will never have to question if their children will be welcome as they grow and learn more about who they are.

Together we will name and celebrate this milestone in the life of our vibrant, loving, welcoming congregation during worship on February 4, with cake and celebration during the Formation Hour (9:20am). Please be sure to join us for this important step in the life of our congregation.

# CLC Social Ministry and Mission March 2024



Each month the Social Ministry highlights a special giving opportunity pertaining to hunger, homelessness/housing, or mission. **New Creation** (2102 N. Calumet Ave.) was created several years ago as a center for homeless men in Valpo and Porter County. The Men's Center currently offers supportive services for homeless men year-round during daytime hours and overnights at area churches. The Resale Shop is always in need of donated furniture and appliances, household and office supplies, laundry essentials and toiletries, and cleaning supplies and paper goods.

New Creation Men's Center helps educate the community on the problem of homelessness in Porter County and on the challenges faced by clients, with the goal to create self-sufficiency. For numerous years now, from April to October, CLC members have assisted the Men's Shelter program in several ways i.e., hosting men overnight at CLC on Saturdays (Apr.-Oct.), preparing/serving meals (dinner and breakfast), and taking time to sit and talk with the men who are taking advantage of Shelter services. Along with six other churches (one each night), CLC is planning to resume the overnight program with New Creation on Saturday evening, April 13, 2024. Please see various announcements in March about how CLC folks can volunteer for time slots and/or and bring meals on Saturdays beginning soon and continuing through the summer.



**Gabriel's Horn** in South Haven/Portage is a Shelter for Homeless Women and Children. The short term shelter provides a safe, temporary shelter, food, linens, and basic supplies at no cost. Services include an aftercare program, arts & crafts classes, counseling, case management, and transportation. The Shelter helps lives rebuild, return to independence, and find dignity-through providing shelter, education, counseling, and referrals to community connections.

Help achieve our goal of \$2500 in February (over and above giving combined with CLC's budgeted amount of \$1200). By achieving our goal CLC will help **New Creation** and **Gabriel's Horn** continue to thrive. Lutheran World Relief News: According to LWR, FLEECE hats, blankets, sleepers, jackets, shirts, pants-anything with fleece is not being accepted. Fleece is made from plastic water bottles and does not breathe as a natural fiber does. It is too HOT. Also, fleece sheds minute plastic pellets not able to be seen by the naked eye. The shedding particles enter the body system causing blockage even found in body organs. Check out clothing tags sewn into the garment's body seams to see what type fiber is being used. The tag at the back of the neck is not specific enough. Some jackets that resemble fleece are made from polyester fabric. That fabric is acceptable.

#### CLC Congregation,

It is baffling to think that the month of March and the season of Lent is already upon us! As we've entered the season of Lent, it also marks the start of decisions regarding what Lenten disciplines we will adopt, what things we will give up, and a time of self-examination. Alongside all of these things, Lent is a season of holding on to hope, especially in the face of despair.

I was especially thinking about the idea of this as I was traveling two weekends ago. With the intensity of recent weather, many of the roads and expressways have taken on a multitude of potholes and cracks, making them more difficult to drive on than normal. However, despite the potholes and rough patches I came across during my travels, I continued to move forward in my commute. Part of my ability to do this came with a deepened level of concentration on the road in front of me.

Lent, for me, is this image of the road with potholes. These obstacles make the journey more complex, more bumpy, but we continue to trek forward by holding onto hope and by taking on a deepened level of examination, both of ourselves and what is around us. It is hope that continues to move us forward; hope in God's promises, hope in what is to come, hope in Jesus' footsteps right alongside our own.

Whatever it may be that is adding weight in your life right now, it is that hope and holding steadfast to our God that moves us through each season we enter. As Paul wrote, "We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed" (2 Corinthians 4:8-9). As you walk through this season of Lent, whether it is a smoother journey or one that is filled with potholes and bumps, I hope that the joy of Easter, of Jesus overcoming death, is a reminder that we too overcome our own potholes and obstacles with God's guidance, faithfulness, and love for us.

**Phone:** Call Thrivent Financial at 1-800-847-4836. When prompted by the electronic answering system, say "*Thrivent Choice*." Follow the remaining prompts, and a representative will come on the line to assist you. You will need your Thrivent membership ID number and will need to answer some other personal questions to verify that you are the Thrivent member who is on the line.

# Join the continuing series in the Faith Formation hour!

Join us during the weeks of Lent for the study of *The Color of Compromise* by Jemar Tisby. This book and video series introduces us to the roots of racial injustice in the American church. The six sessions at CLC will take us on an historical, sociological, and religious journey from the American colonial period right through the Black Lives Matter movement and charts a path forward to replace established patterns and systems of complicity with bold, courageous, immediate action.

The author, Jemar Tisby (BA, University of Notre Dame; MDiv, Reformed Theological Seminary), is President of The Witness: A Black Christian Collective, where he writes about race, religion, politics, and culture. He is also cohost of the Pass the Mic podcast and is studying for a PhD in History at the University of Mississippi with a focus on race religion, and social movements in the twentieth century.

We meet at 9:20am in the Church Hall (big room next to the kitchen). Dates for the series are March 3<sup>rd</sup>, March 17<sup>th</sup>, March 24<sup>th</sup>, and April 14<sup>th</sup>.
