John 6:60-69

The struggle with His _____ . (vv. 60–62)

"This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" (v 60)

APPLICATION: Jesus' words are often a stumbling block when it comes to our sin. When God's Word confronts us, do we resist it or receive it?

"Then what will you think if you see the Son of Man ascend to heaven again?" (v 62)

The source of true _____ . (vv. 63–65)

"The Spirit alone gives eternal life. Human effort accomplishes nothing." (v 63)

APPLICATION: The gospel offends human pride because it removes boasting and makes us utterly dependent on God.

The Separation of the _____ . (vv. 66–67)

At this point many of his disciples turned away and deserted him. (v 66)

APPLICATION: A shallow faith cannot withstand hard truths – only a surrendered heart can.

The statement of the _____ . (vv. 68–69)

"Lord, to whom would we go? You have the words that give eternal life. We believe, and we know you are the Holy One of God." (vv. 68-69)

APPLICATION: True disciples may wrestle with doubt, but they refuse to leave Jesus.

The Gospel either drives us away in offense or draws us deeper in faith.
