Week 2 Genesis 1:27-31a

We are made in God's image and blessed by God to be generous too.



CREATING AN ALTAR SPACE AT HOME

+ Green is the color for Pentecost

Find a scrap piece of green cloth, an old green shirt, a cloth napkin/towel, or even a piece of green construction paper and place it in the middle of your kitchen table or coffee table.

+ Add a small bowl with water

This is a reminder of our baptism.

+ Add a small candle to light as you worship

For households with little one's or apartments that don't allow wax candles, you could use a batteryoperated candle, or a candle made from construction paper, if an open flame is not an option.

+ Add a small cross to the space

This could be a cross from your wall, a necklace charm, or one made from paper or scrap wood.

WHO IS THIS FOR?

+ **Everyone and anyone who lives in your household can gather together.**Adults, children, college students, and pets! "Connect" with as many generations as possible!

SUGGESTIONS AS YOU PREPARE FOR WORSHIP AT YOUR TABLE

+ Children/Youth could help lead different parts of your worship time.

They can set up the altar space, read the Bible story, share their own prayers, sing, or color.

+ You can invite grandparents, grandchildren, cousins, neighbors, friends, etc. to join you for worship using your phone, or Facetime/Skype or another video chat platform.

Feel free to email them this worship order so they can follow along, too!

- + **If you are a 1-person household** and are unable to call or video chat family or friends, perhaps you could write in a journal as a part of these worship experiences.
- + Prepare a space that is most comfortable for you.

You can worship at your kitchen table, coffee table, on the rug in the kids' room, or in your sunroom surrounded by green plants and windows.

CREATIVE PRAYER IN YOUR HOME

- + Create a prayer wall/box/basket for your weekly prayers
 Use a dry erase board, post-it notes on a wall or fridge door, a bulletin board, or scraps of paper
- + **Text prayers** or written notes of encouragement or prayers to loved ones or church friends.

- + How does being created in God's image influence your giving?




WORSHIP

+ OFFERING +

Whether we worship in a church building or in our homes - as people of faith we are reminded of God's abundance and the many ways we have been called to share these gifts with others. This circle of kindness strengthens relationships and the mission of the church. Here are a few for your household as you practice generosity.

- + Gather a gift of money, or write a check, and send this monetary gift to your congregation in the mail; or if your congregation has online giving through an app or on their website, you can take a moment to send a gift digitally.
- + Write a card or letter to a grandparent, elder, shut-in or a resident at the care center.
- + Draw or color a picture to place at your home altar, or to give/mail to someone.
- + When buying groceries or essentials, plan to share 10% of your purchases with your local food shelf
- + Consider sharing 10% of an unexpected financial gift with your congregation
- + Place your weekly contribution in your 10-10-80 container. (see "Other Ideas" below for instructions)

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OTHER IDEAS FOR FAITH FORMATION DURING THE WEEK

- + 10-10-80 A conversation about intentional, thoughtful management of our money
 - "Share—Save—Spend" (Or, 10-10-80) is a model that encourages us to look at what we have, and allocate it to one of three areas:

+ First, We **SHARE** and be generous with 10% of our income or allowance. + Second, We **SAVE** 10% of our income or allowance as a step toward planning for the future (college, retirement, unexpected needs or crisis)

+ Third, We **SPEND** 80% on daily needs and wants

- 2. **The goal** is to live "10-10-80" regardless of how little or how much our income/allowance.
- 3. **Use coins to demonstrate** with young people what 10% looks like. Practice various examples.

+ Give each person a dollar or two in coins.

- + Ask them to figure out what 10% would be.
 - + Think about WHO you could share that with? Who might need that 10%? What are some organizations or ministries that could use help?
 - + Think about WHAT you hope to save up for. Saving 10% can add up quickly! + What are some examples of the "needs" and "wants" that you have?

- + Add up everyone's money how much do you have in total? What would 10% of that look like? Who might need it? What could change when you share that 10%?
- 4. **Create a Share-Save-Spend container** using materials you have around the house a cardboard box, three plastic containers or jars, three piggy banks, three ziplock bags, etc. + Invite everyone to make a personal goal or agree on a family goal for SHARING 10%.
- + Take a nature walk; bring along a bag or container to collect small nature items. Once you return home, spill them out on a table, the floor, or deck and examine each item. What does it look like? Smell like? Does is have a texture? Where did it come from? How does it grow or form?
- + Create Yourselves: Using butcher paper and markers, or sidewalk chalk outside, trace the members of your household or draw an outline of a person on a small piece of paper. Color it in and decorate it to look like you. Encourage the other members of the household to surround your image with words that they think describe you (kind, helpful, funny, musical, etc.).
- + Playdoh Creations: create some new animals or fish out of playdoh; what will you call these new "creatures?" What makes them special or unique? Where do they live?
- + Live It Out: Choose a time to use this resource (pages 6-7) this week as a way to respond to God's word and actively participate in practicing generosity as a household!
 - + Conversation Questions can be done during a meal, in the car, on a walk, etc.
 - + Storvtime re-reading a scripture story can help us to see just how "alive" God's Word is! Take time to read and think about a word or phrase that stood out. What might God be saying to you through those words?
 - + Action A fun and interactive way to remember how generosity shows up through the special people in our lives.
 - + Challenge What does 10% look like in your household? This week's challenge helps us to see the abundance of books.

Being Generous: The WHY

Conversation Goal

Identify this household's giving patterns and practices

Conversation #1

Our Household Identity and Story

Do your family members know how much you share and give of your financial wealth? With so many methods available to exchange currency, it is easy for the significance of giving to be overlooked and unknown to one another. Research shows children learn sound financial health and generosity when they see parents and significant adults model this as a priority in their lives.

If you do not already have an established pattern of giving, consider a conversation to discuss when and how you as a household might begin.

Key Question

Does each person in this household know how we share and are generous with what we have been given?

Discussion Prompts

- How does this household talk about money? What words do we use?
- Who decides how we distribute our money, especially related to regular giving?
- What is tithing? Do we do it? (Use the internet to look up the word and meaning)
- Do we support a church or institution of faith? Organizations or other causes?
- Do we have an emergency fund? Are we saving for college, vacation, house repairs, retirement, etc.?
- What are our household's essential expenditures for living? Which ones are Wants? Which ones are Needs?
- How much of our spending is influenced by advertising?
- Why do we share? Give?

God's Story Genesis 1:27-31a (CEV). "So, God created humans in God's own image; God made men and women. God gave them a blessing and said: Have a lot of children! 
Affirmation + Blessing
