

# Weekly Discipleship Plan (Week of October 5<sup>th</sup>)

#### **Shorter Catechism Question:**

Q. 24. How is Christ a prophet?

A. 24. As a prophet, Christ reveals the will of God to us for our salvation by his word and spirit.

**Scripture Memory**: Exodus 20:1-7 And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. "You shall have no other gods before me. "You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments. "You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.

#### **DAILY DEVOTIONS**

#### Day 1

Reading: Leviticus 1-2

<u>Questions</u>: How does the process of offering symbolize respect and reverence for the divine? How does the practice of offering the firstfruits reflect our attitude towards giving to God? How does the detailed nature of these instructions affect your understanding of God's character? <u>End with prayer</u>: pray for two unchurched people you know.

#### Day 2

Reading: Leviticus 3-4

<u>Questions</u>: What is the significance of choosing an animal "without blemish" for the peace offering? In Lev. 4:2, why would God require a sin offering for an unintentional act if it was done unknowingly? What can we learn from the fact that all individuals, regardless of status, must atone for their sins? <u>End with prayer</u>: pray for friends, relatives, and neighbors who don't have saving faith in Jesus.

## Day 3

Reading: Leviticus 5

Questions: What does this chapter teach us about the nature of sin?

How does the provision for those unable to afford traditional offerings reflect on God's character?

How does the concept of restitution in this passage relate to making amends in the modern world?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for the Lord to renew your mind with His truth.

### Day 4

Reading: Leviticus 6

Questions: What does the continual fire on the altar symbolize in our spiritual life?

What does the process of anointing a priest teach us about spiritual succession and leadership?

How does this passage highlight the consequences of violating trust and integrity?

End with prayer: pray for the great commission to be fulfilled.

Day 5

Reading: Leviticus 7

Questions: How does the concept of "uncleanness" affect our relationship with God and with others?

In the context of these laws, how do you perceive God's requirement for order in worship?

How can these detailed instructions inform our attitude towards our religious observances?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for God's help and guidance in sharing the gospel with others.

Day 6

Reading: Leviticus 8

Questions: What is the significance of the anointing oil in the consecration process?

In what ways does the ritual of blood application in the consecration process apply to the contemporary Christian journey?

How does the communal involvement in the consecration ceremony speak to the role of community in our spiritual journey today?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for people serving in local, state, and national government.

Day 7

Reading: Leviticus 9-10
