



Weekly Discipleship Plan (Week of November 30th)

Shorter Catechism Question:

Q. 32. What benefits do those who are effectively called share in this life?

A. 32. In this life, those who are effectively called share justification, adoption, sanctification, and the other benefits that either go with or come from them.

Scripture Memory: Exodus 20:1-17 And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. "You shall have no other gods before me. "You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments. "You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore, the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. ¹²"Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you. ¹³"You shall not murder. ¹⁴"You shall not commit adultery. ¹⁵"You shall not steal. ¹⁶"You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. ¹⁷"You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's."

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Reading: Deuteronomy 8

Questions: Why did God choose to humble and test the Israelites in the wilderness?

What are the dangers of pride and self-sufficiency in our relationship with God?

How can you foster a heart of obedience in a world that celebrates rebellion?

End with prayer: pray for the spiritual revival of the community and nation.

Day 2

Reading: Deuteronomy 9-10

Questions: How did Moses respond to the Israelites' sin with the golden calf?

In what ways can you "circumcise" your heart in your current circumstances?

How does the story of Moses' intercession challenge our prayer lives?

End with prayer: pray for the effectiveness of Bethel's ministries.

Day 3

Reading: Deuteronomy 11

Questions: How do past experiences shape our faith in God?

What methods can we adopt to ensure we share spiritual wisdom with the next generation?

What tools has God given us to help us stay rooted in our faith amidst worldly distractions?

End with prayer: pray for opportunities to share the gospel with family and friends.

Day 4

Reading: Deuteronomy 12

Questions: Why was it essential for the Israelites to destroy pagan worship sites?

Why do you think God emphasized joy in worship?

What does the chapter teach about God's perspective on traditions?

End with prayer: pray for the church-planting movement in Mexico.

Day 5

Reading: Deuteronomy 13-14

Questions: What steps should a congregation take when confronted with false teachings?

How should the principles of tithing be applied today?

How should the concept of being "holy to the Lord" transform a believer's daily behavior?

End with prayer: pray for growth in spiritual maturity and personal discipline.

Day 6

Reading: Deuteronomy 15

Questions: How can we cultivate a heart of generosity in our consumer-driven society?

In what ways does society benefit when we uplift and support the poor and marginalized?

How will you commit to fostering a more compassionate and just society?

End with prayer: pray to gain a deeper understanding of what it means to be "in Christ."

Day 7

Reading: Deuteronomy 16-17

Questions: How does the Feast of Weeks reflect gratitude and the spirit of giving?

Why do you think the king was warned against sending people back to Egypt?

Why is it crucial for leaders today to remain humble?

End with prayer: pray for a greater understanding of God's character and ability.
