★ Suggested Song

★ Catechism for Young Children Question (for families with children *elementary and under*)

Q. 15. Who wrote the Bible?

A. 15. Chosen men who were guided by the Holy Spirit.

Q. 16. Who were our first parents?

A. 16. Adam and Eve.

Q. 17. What were our first parents made of?

A. 17. God made Adam's body out of the earth, and He made Eve from Adam's body.

★ Shorter Catechism Question (for families with children in *middle school & up*)

Q. 14. What is sin?

A. 14. Sin is disobeying or not conforming to God's law in any way.

★ Scripture Memory: 1 John 4:7-12

★ *"Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us."*

DAILY DEVOTIONS (5 TOTAL)

Day 1

★ Reading: Romans 10:14-21

★ Questions: According to these verses, what responsibility do all believers have to other people?

What are some of the means we can use to help make sure the whole world hears the gospel?

Who was involved in your hearing the gospel for the first time?

★ End with prayer – pray for opportunities to share the gospel with family and friends.

Day 2

★ Reading: Romans 10:15-21

★ Questions: In context, to what does this quotation from Isaiah 52:7 refer? How does Paul apply this?

How did the Jews respond to the message from God? Is this still true today?

Does everyone brought up in the church listen to and receive the gospel ultimately? Why/why not?

★ End with prayer – pray for the church planting movement in Mexico.

Day 3

★ Reading: Romans 10:17; Ephesians 2:8-9; Hebrews 11:1

★ Questions: What is faith? From where do we get faith? How does this add importance to our study of the Bible?

What are some excuses Israel gave for not believing God's message?

What are some reasons people have given you or you have used for unbelief in the past?

★ End with prayer – pray for growth in spiritual maturity and personal discipline.

Day 4

★ Reading: Romans 10:21

★ Questions: List several times in Israel's history that God 'held out His hands' to them and they rejected Him?

What does verse 21 teach us about Israel? About ourselves? About God and His nature?

How can we use this truth in our daily lives?

★ End with prayer – pray to gain a deeper understanding of what it means to be "in Christ."

Day 5

★ Reading: Romans 10:21

★ Questions: Who is responsible for unbelief? What have we learned about human responsibility in Romans 10? How can this information help us better share the gospel?

What are some ways we can demonstrate thanksgiving to God for the ways He has held out His hands to us?

★ End with prayer – pray for a greater understanding of God's character and ability.
