

Weekly Discipleship Plan (Week of August 3rd)

Shorter Catechism Question:

Q. 15. By what sin did our first parents fall from their original condition?

A. 15. Our first parents' sin was eating the forbidden fruit.

Scripture Memory: Exodus 20:1 And God spoke all these words, saying,

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Day 1

Reading: Genesis 1-2

Questions: What does this passage reveal about God's power and character as Creator?

What does it mean that all humanity is made in God's image (1:26-27)?

How can you reflect God's image more intentionally in your daily life?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for two unchurched people you know.

Day 2

Reading: Genesis 3

<u>Questions</u>: How does the serpent challenge God's word and authority?

How does God demonstrate both justice and mercy in His response to sin?

When you face temptation, how can you rely on God's truth to resist it?

End with prayer: pray for friends, relatives, and neighbors who don't have saving faith in Jesus.

Day 3

Reading: Genesis 4-5

Questions: How does God warn Cain about sin, and what can we learn from His words?

How does the line of Seth (4:26) show a return to calling on God?

What steps can you take to avoid jealousy or anger in your relationships?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for the Lord to renew your mind with His truth.

Day 4

Reading: Genesis 6-7

Questions: How does Noah's righteousness (6:8) demonstrate hope amidst sin?

What does the ark symbolize about God's plan to save and protect?

How can you trust God more fully in the face of challenges or storms in life?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for the great commission to be fulfilled.

Day 5

Reading: Genesis 8-9

Questions: How does God's command to "be fruitful and multiply" echo His original mandate?

How does this passage highlight the need for accountability in leadership?

In what areas of your life do you need to trust in God's unchanging promises?

End with prayer: pray for God's help and guidance in sharing the gospel with others.

Day 6

Reading: Genesis 10-11

<u>Questions</u>: What does the table of nations in Genesis 10 teach us about the spread of humanity after the flood?

How does the story of the Tower of Babel reflect humanity's pride and desire for independence from God?

In what areas of your life might you be relying on your own strength rather than trusting God?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for people serving in local, state, and national government.

Day 7

Reading: Genesis 12-13

<u>Questions</u>: What does God's call to Abram recorded in Genesis 12:1-3 reveal about His plan for redemption?

How does Abram's obedience demonstrate faith in God's promises?

How can you be a blessing to others in your family, community, or workplace?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for God's protection and blessing on our first responders (police, firefighters, doctors, nurses, etc...).
