

Weekly Discipleship Plan (Week of August 17th)

Shorter Catechism Question:

Q. 17. What happened to man in the fall?

A. 17. Man fell into a condition of sin and misery.

Scripture Memory: Exodus 20:1-3 And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. "You shall have no other gods before me.

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Day 1

Reading: Genesis 25

<u>Questions</u>: What does Abraham's remarriage and the division of his inheritance teach about his

priorities?

What does the struggle between Jacob and Esau reveal about God's sovereignty and

human choices?

How can you prioritize spiritual blessings over temporary desires in your life?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for the spiritual revival of the community and nation.

Day 2

Reading: Genesis 26

Questions: How does Isaac repeat Abraham's mistakes, and how does God remain faithful to him?

How does God reaffirm His covenant to Isaac (26:24-25)?

How can you seek peace and reconciliation in conflicts in your life?

End with prayer: pray for the effectiveness of Bethel's ministries.

Day 3

Reading: Genesis 27

Questions: What does Rebekah and Jacob's deception show about their faith and flaws?

How does Esau's response to losing the blessing highlight the consequences of poor

decisions?

What steps can you take to trust God's timing and avoid taking shortcuts in His plans?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for opportunities to share the gospel with family and friends.

Day 4

Reading: Genesis 28-29

Questions: What does Jacob's dream at Bethel reveal about God's presence and promises?

How does Jacob's work for Laban reflect God's plan for his life, even amid deception?

How can you trust God's presence in difficult circumstances, as Jacob did?

End with prayer: pray for the church-planting movement in Mexico.

Day 5

Reading: Genesis 30

Questions: How do Rachel and Leah's rivalry reflect human struggles with jealousy and trust?

How does God's provision for Jacob (despite Laban's manipulation) show His sovereignty?

What areas of your life might require surrendering control to God?

End with prayer: pray for growth in spiritual maturity and personal discipline.

Day 6

Reading: Genesis 31

Questions: Why does Jacob finally leave Laban?

How does Laban respond to Jacob's deception?

What steps can you take in your life to ensure you are a person of your word?

End with prayer: pray to gain a deeper understanding of what it means to be "in Christ."

Day 7

Reading: Genesis 32

Questions: What does Jacob's prayer before meeting Esau (32:9-12) reveal about his growing faith?

How does Jacob's wrestling with God (32:24-32) reflect a turning point in his relationship with God?

How can you bring your fears and struggles to God in prayer, as Jacob did?

<u>End with prayer</u>: pray for a greater understanding of God's character and ability.
