# **Dedication Sunday @ New Property**

## "Planting Pregnant" - What Is Our True Mission?

The church was founded not to build a brand, but to multiply and plant other churches. What does it mean for a church—or for us personally—to "plant pregnant"? How does embracing multiplication over addition change the way we view ministry, discipleship, and our role within the church?

### "From Everyday Places to Sacred Spaces" - Redefining Ministry

The sermon highlights how God turns ordinary spaces into holy ground through His people. Can you share a moment when your home, workplace, or everyday environment became a sacred space because you followed God's prompting? How can we more intentionally create sacred spaces in the everyday places around us?

#### "Fearlessly Making Known the Gospel" - Living the Great Commission

The heart of Epic Life has been fearless proclamation, with hundreds stepping from death to life. What does it look like to "fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel" in our own lives? What fears or obstacles most often hold us back from sharing Christ, and how can we encourage one another to move past them?

### "The Harvest Is Plentiful" - Our Responsibility to the Surrounding Community

Thousands of homes, schools, and families surround this new campus—a field ready for harvest. As we open this campus, what specific needs do you see in our community right now—spiritual, relational, emotional? How can we become the kind of workers Jesus prayed for in Matthew 9:38, ready to enter the harvest?

#### "Time, Talent, and Treasure" - Personal Stakes in Sacred Ground

The call was made to drive physical stakes into the ground as a symbol of personal commitment. When you consider writing your name on a stake and declaring, "Lord, this is Your place—use me," what does that commitment look like for you? In what ways is God asking you to invest your time, talent, or treasure in this next chapter?

Over 337 lives baptized and countless testimonies of transformation were shared. Why is it important for a church family to continually share testimonies? How do stories of salvation, healing, and restoration fuel our faith and remind us of our purpose?

### "More Than a Building" - Becoming a Family, Not Just Attenders

The pastor emphasized that God's plan is not a campus, but a people—a family. What distinguishes a church family from a church crowd? What intentional choices can we make so Epic Life remains a place of belonging, not just a place of weekly attendance?

## "A Beacon of Hope" - Vision for the Future

This property is envisioned to be a place of refuge, peace, and life throughout the week. Imagine this campus five years from now—what do you hope people in our city will say about this place? What ministries, gatherings, or movements do you dream of seeing birthed here?

# "Here Am I, Send Me" – Our Role in Kingdom Advance

Each person was invited to drive a stake declaring surrender of time, talent, and treasure. What role do you sense God calling you to play in this next season? How can we support each other in saying "yes" to the Kingdom, even when it costs us comfort, convenience, or control?
