1 Peter 4:10 reminds us that each of us has been entrusted with gifts to serve others. What spiritual gift(s) do you see in yourself—or in others in this group—and how might margin make space to use those gifts more faithfully?

Treasure with Eternal Impact

We often think of treasure as money, but the sermon reminded us that it includes everything God has entrusted to us. What are some practical ways we can use our possessions, homes, or resources to advance the Kingdom of God and bless others?
