I suppose it is inevitable that during such a time there are bound to be articles that address the current situation. One article, in particular, caught my attention. The article was titled "Religious Aspect of the American Revolution of 1861." This article was published in the July 1861 edition by Tolbert Fanning. I want to share with you the following words from the conclusion of this article:

Fanning was expressing his ardent desire for God-fearing men of influence to do what they could to bring about peace. This calls to mind the message of Jesus from Matthew 5 "Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called sons of God" (Matt. 5:9). Paul also said, "If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men."

Our country may not be in a Civil War in the same sense that it was in the 1800s, but the division is not far off. I pray that cooler heads would unite to prevent such if we found ourselves in a position of war. You may think you have no power to influence the tide of our country, but I do not believe that for a minute. I pray that we would all consider Fanning's words that called for Christians to exert their influence to calm the raging storm in our country.

I know of people who have left their congregations because they were sickened by political posts on social media. What good does it do? Will a headlong attack on our political beliefs cause us to change or will we change anyone with the same? Will a brute force attack change anyone's religious beliefs? It is doubtful Does anyone believe they will change their opponent with these tactics, or do they just want to gratify themselves by trying to prove they are right?

However, if we consistently teach the gospel, I believe we can make a difference but we have to live what we are preaching. We have to show kindness to those who may not deserve it. We have to give the gospel to those we do not like. We have to pray for those who would even seek to do us harm. That is what it means to be a peacemaker. It is that attitude that can diffuse a situation and change peoples hearts. I do not know about you, but I would rather be called a son of God than try to prove I am right to a person that will never believe it or admit it. Love your enemy (Matt. 5:43). Speak the truth in love (Eph. 4:15). Be a peacemaker (Matt. 5:43). Give consideration to your actions and choose ones that will so some good.

A few years back a few men set out to digitize copies of the Gospel Advocate that were no longer under copyright. They were able to put onto a thumb drive, copies of the magazine that run from 1855 to 1963. I have recently been reading some of the old articles from 1861. Officially, the Civil War in the United States ran from April 12, 1861 to May 9, 1865. The magazine suspended publishing for some time during the Civil War, but the files from 1861 are still available.
