Lessons from the Eclipse

Thales of Miletus is the first recorded man to predict a solar eclipse. He said that on May 28, in what we call 585 B.C., there would be a solar eclipse visible in the Middle East. On that day as the Lydians were fighting the Medes in a border dispute, the predicted eclipse occurred. Soldiers from both armies laid down their weapons & gazed into the heavens. The Halys River where they fought became their boundary. Thales became famous & the word he invented, "philosophy," became a common word.

Last week our nation had "eclipse mania." You may have noticed various

reactions:

Some worshiped God. The heavens were created to show God's glory. Gen. 1:14-15 shows that heavenly objects were created to measure time, to serve as symbols, and to give light. In 1919 a total solar eclipse lasted for over 6 minutes & scientists measured light from the stars visible during the darkness. As starlight traveled near the sun towards earth, the sun's gravity bent the light. God created the universe's laws. How can the sun & moon appear to be the same size in the sky? The sun is 400 times larger than the moon but the moon is 400 times closer to earth than the sun is. What are the odds of that happening? No other planet in our solar system experiences a total solar eclipse.

Some feared. Is this an omen of the end of the world or some great catastrophe? Jeremiah 10:1-5 "Hear...learn not...be not dismayed." The way of the nations is their view of the heavenly bodies which were associated with gods. They worshiped these objects as gods who controlled of their life. However, these are not gods, but are part of creation & God controls them. God wants us to be motivated by faith, not fear.

Some Robbed God. Modern science was built on the foundation that God was a God of order & precision. Science was the way that man's dominion was exercised

"An eclipse is a cosmic reminder that the universe is not a random collection of matter and events that happened by chance. The cosmos is so finely tuned that we can know precisely where every heavenly body will be 200 years from now, down to the minute. These events remind us that the universe is not an accident, and neither are we. God made
