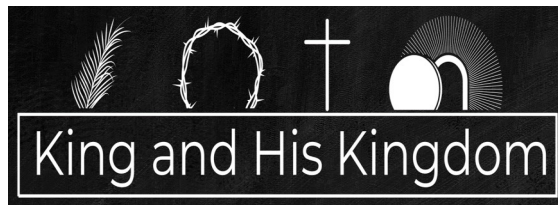

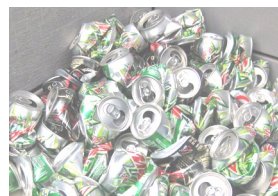

World Bible School

Tim Yeager, World Bible School's Chief Information Officer, reports that March was one of the highest counts of adoptions made. That means that many seekers of Biblical truth were selected by teachers to be their students. The student board from where they're selected has almost forty seekers every morning. The Sower's work is done almost daily whether online, postal or smart phone. There are hundreds of baptisms each month.

A follow-up system is in place to track the progress of those who request baptism into Christ, It may reflect "pending" until a WBS contact in a country as phoned or personally met the student. It may say "finished" when we have a new brother or sister in the Lord. Sometimes pictures of baptisms are available for rejoicing. The WBS curriculum includes spiritual growth after baptism. Membership in a congregation is strongly encouraged for fellowship, worship and further studies.
