Quick Guide to Biblical History



Creation and the Fall: Genesis 1-5
Creation; Adam and Eve; Fall of Man; God's Promise; Generations of Adam
 God created a perfect world for man and promised salvation after man brought sin into that world.



The Flood: Genesis 6-10
Flood; God's Covenant with Noah
 The worldwide flood cleansed the earth and preserved Noah's family to help fulfill God's plan.



The Scattering: Genesis 11
Tower of Babel
 Confusing the languages dispersed humanity across the world.



The Patriarchs: Genesis 12-50
Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; God's Three Fold Promise; 12 Sons of Jacob
 Abraham's family was set apart as God's people to fulfill His promises.



Exodus/Wilderness Wandering: Exodus- Deuteronomy
Ten Plagues; First Promise of a Great Nation Fulfilled; Mosaic Law Established; Tabernacle Constructed
 The Israelites left the bondage of Egypt and headed toward the Promised Land. When they rebelled, God issued punishment.



The Conquest: Joshua
Second Promise of the Land Fulfilled
 God's people moved to Canaan, land promised to Abraham.



The Judges: Judges and Ruth; 1 Samuel 1-7
Cycle of Sin, Servitude, Supplication, Salvation, and Silence
 From Othniel to Samuel, God provided leadership for His people.



United Kingdom: 1 Samuel 8–1 Kings 11; 1 Chronicles 10–2 Chronicles 9; Psalms—Song of Solomon
Saul; David; and Solomon
 God's people asked for an earthly king, and He chose leaders.

Divided Kingdom: 1 Kings 12–2 Kings 17; 2 Chronicles 10-20; Isaiah, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Jonah, and Micah
Asa, Jehoshaphat, Jotham, and Hezekiah
 32 kings: Judah had four good kings; Israel had only wicked kings.

Judah Alone: 2 Kings 17-25; 2 Chronicles 30-36; Jeremiah, Obadiah, Nahum, Habakkuk, and Zephaniah
Tribes of Judah and Benjamin
 Judah continues for almost 100 years before they are removed from the Promised Land because of their sin.

Captivity: Lamentations, Ezekiel, and Daniel
Daniel's Prophecy of the Kingdoms; the Decree of Cyrus
 Daniel was a prophet to royalty in the Babylonian and Persian kingdoms, while Ezekiel warned the people what would happen to other surrounding nations.

Restoration: Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi
Zerubbabel, Ezra, and Nehemiah
 The Jews returned home in three waves and began rebuilding the temple and their relationship with God. Esther became Queen of Persia.

Prophetic Silence Period: Daniel 7-12
Persian, Macedonian, Grecian, and Roman Rule
 God did not speak directly to man, but the prophecies of Daniel were fulfilled during these years.

The Coming of the Messiah: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John
Birth, life, and earthly ministry of Jesus Christ
 The Son of God came to earth in human form, taught disciples, and died for the sins of all.

The Beginning of the Church: Acts
Third Promise of All Nations Blessed Fulfilled; Apostles
 Before Jesus ascended to heaven, He told His apostles to take His teachings into all the world.

The Growth of the Church: Acts-Revelation
Letters of Instruction; Paul, Barnabas, and Timothy
 The first Christians established congregations across the Roman Empire and began to suffer persecution.
