LET THE PEOPLE READ!

In 1987 at the Science Hill church of Christ in Murfreesboro, TN, Marion West photocopied some religious tracts and distributed them to church members. Several were mailed to Ghana West Africa through the World Bible School and its students in that country. In some way that is unknown to us, one of the tracts found its way into Nigeria (two countries and several hundred miles from Ghana). A short time later the Science Hill congregation received a letter from a Methodist minister in Nigeria who had studied the tract mailed from Murfreesboro, TN. He asked for more information on non-denominational Christianity. His congregation of 315 needed to know what the Scriptures teach on immersion, the Lords' Supper, and the one church of the Bible. Although he himself was convinced these matters were true, he had not yet attempted to teach the congregation. He requested more information on these matter. He also asked for our prayers in his behalf. Who would have thought that a photocopied tract from Middle Tennessee would be responsible for influencing several hundred people on another continent?

Life— changing power is in the Scriptures. When folks read the Bible for themselves, remarkable things happen. On woman in North Carolina read Acts 2:38 aloud at the request of her Christian friend. "I've been studying the Bible for years and that's the first time I've ever read this!" she said. No wonder that Paul said that the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation.

A Challenge For This Week

What Does Real Faith Involve?

In that great chapter on faith, Hebrews 11, we can gain a clear picture what real faith involves. From the examples given in verses 4-10 we can see that real faith is much more than belief alone.

Real faith involves the word of God. Abel “obtained witness” from God (v.4). Enoch had “testimony” from God. Noah was “divinely warned” (v.7). Abraham “was called” (v.8) by God. They all looked to God’s revelation as the basis of their faith – so should we.

Real faith involves trusting God. Noah’s trust in God caused him to be “moved with godly fear” (v.7). Abraham “went out, not knowing where he was go-ing” (v.8) in full reliance upon God. He also “waited for the city which has foundations” (v.10). They all fully trusted in God – so should we.

Real faith involves obedience and action. Abel “offered to God” (v.4) exactly what God wanted. No-ah “prepared an ark” (v.7) when asked to do so. Abraham “obeyed when he was called to go out” (v.8). They all got busy with their faith doing what God desired of them – so should we.

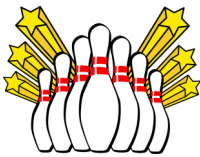
Trail Life USA
