Integrity

Psalms 84:11-12

One of the elders in Burlington, North Carolina earns his money by driving a truck. As a young man he began driving a truck, and in order to continue driving, he became a member of a union. This man worked, contributing to the union by means of dues. Part of the benefits he shared as a union member was a certain amount of income when he retired. The company for whom this man worked, filed bankruptcy just 64 days before he could have retired. Because of his union membership, he will still get some retirement income, but had he been able to work the remaining 64 days his retirement income would have been over \$400 more per month.

I asked him if he could not find another job driving a truck to finish out his 64 days. He told me that he had been offered only one union job driving a truck. I asked "why not take that job for just 64 days?" He replied "The job was driving a truck hauling beer cans, and I don't think that is the kind of job a Christian should be doing."

What a powerful example! I am so thankful we have elders with that kind of courage and devotion to the Lord! If anyone could ever rationalize, surely he could. Nearing retirement, most of his retirement income taken away by just 64 days! Surely a man could haul beer cans for just 64 days! That doesn't mean he will be drinking beer. He is not selling it, just delivering cans, and that for just 2 months! When he gets the extra retirement income from that period of employment, he will have more money to give to the Lord's work. He could do this, He could do that...we could certainly rationalize and... on and on we could go.

Such a decision take faith in the Lord, recognizing God's standards, and seeking first the Kingdom. I believe the Lord will take care of this brother when he does retire.

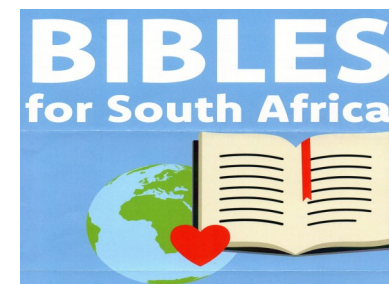
