WHAT DID YOU EXPECT?

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is God's power for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek." Romans 1:16

Recently, I had the opportunity to have conversation with an Islamic family who recently moved to our area. They were incredibly nice and very willing to discuss religion and theological matters. Honestly this took me by surprise, I assumed that, because we believed differently we would just ignore the topic or if one tried to bring it up, the other would dismiss it. I told this to the gentleman as we discussed the Quran and the Bible, Jesus and Mohammed, God, and Allah, etc. He said, "Well, what did you expect? I believe my faith, you believe yours, If we truly believe, we must talk about it." He's right. I not know if our conversation will lead to anything more. But I do know that it was a wakeup call for me,

It is not easy to talk about our faith in today's world. Some people will rebuke us for being radical, hateful, and unloving. However, I am finding that those people exist in a very small minority, instead, it seems to me that most people enjoy discussing new ideas and perspectives. If we really believe what we say we believe, we must share it with others.

Paul did this in Athens (a city of pagan idol worshipers) in Acts 17. Paul did not scream at them or attack anyone with words. Instead Paul methodically laid out why their belief system was wrong and why his was correct. Sharing our faith requires that we know what we believe, we know what others believe, we have a response to that, and we think about what is truly correct. When we share our faith, we are not belittling others. We are simply being unashamed of the gospel. Let's look for opportunities to share our faith publicly and privately. We must let our community know who we are, what we believe and why they should too. There's work to be done!

LISTEN TO GOD

Man's obligation to God is simple—listen to HIM. A speaking God demands listening ears. Man is to be open honest, humble and obedient. Case closed. James told us to be quick to hear, slow to speak (James 1:19). Prayer is talking to God. We know that. But prayer is also listening to God. We usually forget that. Don't pray and then run off. Fallen man needs to listen to God more than he talks to God.

Listening, however, is far more than listening. God saves us by our ears, not our eyes.

Our eyes are always "on." You have to turn your ears on and keep them on. We are under the authority of God. We go by the Bible. We live holy lives. We are not here to pass a religious test. We are here



for abundant life (John 10:10).

To listen involves the entire self. We have listening ears, minds, hearts and lives. The Bible constantly warns: "But they would not listen." When God tells you to do something, do it! This is obedience. What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us.

The "Big Sin" today is to offend someone. How angry do they get. But not one warns about offending God. Man cannot offend God and get by with it . The Word does not bear fruit when it is learned, only when it is applied.

Don't think for God. Listen to Him.

He's Coming

In the last chapter of the last book of the Bible, we have recorded the last words of our Lord to us. Here's something He says to all mankind. "Behold, I am coming quickly and My reward is with Mr, to render to every man according to what he has done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the Last, the beginning and the end" (Rev. 22:12-13).

Now, here's what we learn from this statement:

- Jesus will eventually come back and when He comes, it will all be done quickly...i.e. the resurrection, the change of bodies, and the judgment. There will be no last minute opportunities to readjust our condition before God.
- 2. Jesus will judge "every man" and will do so "according to what he has done." Therefore, it behooves us to get our lives right before God while we have opportunity, When the Lord returns, it will be too late to make any changes.
- 3. We also learn that He is qualified to render just judgment because of who He is. The expressions, 'the Alpha and the Omega" refer to the first and the last letters of the Greek alphabet. We would say, "He is the A and the Z". This just means that He is the one who got the whole creation started and He is the one who will bring it all to an end. Thus, not only is He "the first and the last," but also "the beginning and the end."

There's a great day coming...when it comes, things will happen very quickly. Are you ready for that day?
