"THE MEANEST MAN"

This is a true story about a young evil man. This young man, at the age of 17 years had killed two men. The place was rural Texas. His name was Clyde Thompson (1910-1979). He was sent to death row and was the youngest person ever on death row. His main desire was to escape from prison. While waiting to be put to death, he killed two inmates and was sentenced to three life sentences. The officials at the prison gave him the name "The Meanest Man in Texas." The prison chaplain said, "Thompson was a man without a soul, without hope."

Then one day he heard P.D. Wilmeth preaching on the radio that the guards had. He was baptized six days before he was to be executed. Clyde Thompson got a Bible and started studying, and his life changed for the better. He got out of prison and got married. He has preached the Word of God and saved souls until his death.

The Bible tells us of a person who was walking the same way that Clyde Thompson had walked. This was a man named Saul. Saul was a religious man who thought that he was doing the will of God by helping to stop the new movement called THE WAY - a movement led by a person that was claiming to be the Son of God, which was stirring up the people.

Saul went to the high priest to get letters giving him permission to arrest Christians in Damascus that were in the synagogue, whether they be men or women. He intended to bring them bound to Jerusalem. As he went on his way, he came near Damascus, suddenly there shined round him a light from heaven, and he fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, Why persecutesth thou me?" And He said, "Who art thou Lord?" and the Lord said, "I am Jesus whom thou persecutes: it is hard for you to kick against the pricks." A prick (or goad as it's translated in the NKJV) can be any sharp point that pierces or stings but is generally known as the ox goad: a heavy sharp piece of iron that is used to drive oxen when the animal is to stubborn to move.)

Saul being afraid, trembling and astonished said, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" and the Lord said "Arise and go in to the city and it will be told thee what though must do." Saul was three days without sight, neither did he eat or drink. The Lord sent a vision to Ananias and he said, "I am here Lord." And the Lord said unto him, "Arise and go into the street which is call Straight and inquire in the house of Judas for one called Saul of Tarsus for behold he prays and hath seen in a vision a man named Ananias coming in and putting his hand on him that he might receive his sight."

Then Ananias answered, "Lord, I have heard by many about this man, how much evil he has done to the saints at Jerusalem." But the Lord said unto him, "Go thy way for he is a chosen vessel unto me to bear my Name before the Gentiles and kings and the children of Israel: for I will show him how great things he must suffer for my name's sake." When Saul had eaten and was strengthened and was baptized, he stayed with the disciples a certain number of days who were at Damascus, and straightway he preached Christ in the synagogues, that He is the Son of God.

Here these two men start out as evil, but when they came to know Jesus, their lives changed from evil to good. They gave Clyde Thompson the name "The Meanest Man in Texas." You could say that Saul, before he was converted, was "The Meanest Man in Rome."

But what God did for these two men He can do for you. For it's no secret what God can do.

Heart Religion

Since only a religion of the heart has value, let us see what the Bible includes as part of heart religion. According to the Holy Scriptures heart religion is:



- 1. **Heart-felt.** With the heart man loves (Matthew 22:37) and desires (Romans 10:1). Good feelings by themselves are not an indication that one is right with God but if one is right with God good feeling will result. Rejoicing (a feeling) comes after obedience (Acts 8:36-39). In religion we feel good because we are right, but we are not right with God just because we feel good.
- 2. **Heart-thought.** The heart thinks (Proverbs 23:7); understands (Matthew 13:15) and believes (Romans 10:10). True Christianity involves the intellect.
- 3. **Heart-acted.** True heart religion results in obedience to God's commands (Romans 6:16-17). This includes baptism into Christ (Romans 6:4).

There is a great difference in heart religion and "holler" religion. Is your religion from the heart?
