

# The Book of Romans

Many consider Romans the greatest of Paul's thirteen letters. Although Tertius [a slave name meaning "Number Three"] wrote the letter, Paul dictated the words from the Holy Spirit (Rom. 16:22; 1 Cor. 14:37).

The theme of Romans is "How can a righteous & just God forgive sinful man?" If God ignores the sins of men, He is no longer just. If He casts all men into hell because they sinned, then He is no longer merciful and gracious. God resolved these two irreconcilable positions by the Cross of Jesus (3:23-26).

The premise of Romans is found in 1:16-17 [ASV]: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first & also to the Greek. For therein is revealed a righteousness of God from faith unto faith: as it is written, But the righteous shall live by faith."

What are the main ideas in each chapter?

1—The Gentiles sinned	9—Israel's past
2—The Jews sinned	10—Israel's present
3—All sinned	11—Israel's future
4—Saved like Abraham	12—The Christian's lifestyle
5—Peace with God	13—Relationship with government
6—Dead, buried, & risen with Christ	14—Opinions & unity
7—Delivered from death	15—Opinions & unity
8—No condemnation	16—Greetings from the Churches

Romans begins with the phrase "obedience of faith" (1:5) & ends with it (16:26). This bookend phrase means that the faith which saves is the one that obeys.

More than one commentator has remarked, "If you get the book of Romans, God
