

- 4. **Say "Amen"!** Don't be bashful. If you believe something is well said, let the class know it.
- Take Notes! You will encourage the teacher, set a good example, and have a record for later study.

- Show the Teacher Appreciation! A good word or perhaps a note will encourage him and inspire him to do even better.
- 8. **Disagree Sweetly!** Others will at least know you are listening, and your attitude will make it easier for them to see your point of view and profit from it.
- 9. **Talk the Class Up!** Show excitement and tell someone else what you have gained. They too will become excited.
- 10. **Change!** This is the most difficult part, but a class is of little value if principles are not applied to life.

We Asked For It

Recently we had a day dedicated to prayer and fasting. One of the objectives was to pray for a spiritual awakening in this Country. God has seen fit to answer some of these prayers. The Supreme Court has recently seen fit to overturn Roe V Wade.

Roe V Wade was a TERRIBLE decision that lasted for more than 49 years. It has allowed the aborting of more than 63 MILLION infants since the decision in1973. We prayed for laws like this to be overturned, it has, and now it's time to stand BY it. There is even talk about repealing laws concerning same sex marriage. This is no time to be "politically correct." Christians must view ALL things through the eyes of Jesus, and we know where He stands on the issue of murder and sin (all sin). It's just as simple as that.

The infant inside a woman's body is not "her" body. It is a body (within) a body and no one has the right to take that life. Exodus 21:22–25 prescribes the same penalty—death—for someone who causes the death of a baby in the womb. It was viewed the same as murder. "When men strive together and hit a pregnant woman, so that her children come out, but there is no harm, the one who hit her shall surely be fined, as the woman's husband shall impose on him, and he shall pay as the judges determine. But if there is harm, then you shall pay life for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, burn for burn, wound for wound, stripe for stripe.

Exodus 21:22-25 ESV

As a footnote, abortion and same sex marriage aren't the only two sins that have negatively affected our culture. Consider this: Until the mid 20th century, most U.S. states (especially Southern and Northeastern states) had laws against fornication, adultery or cohabitation. These laws have gradually been abolished or struck down by courts as *unconstitutional*. State criminal laws against adultery are rarely enforced.

As Christians, we should have the conviction to stand up for things the Lord stands for, and to decry the things He does not.
