What is God Like?

God has revealed Himself to man through nature (Psalm 19:1-6) and scripture (Psalm 19:6-14). He possesses qualities that are unique to Deity. No angel or man will ever have these qualities so we say they are incommunicable or metaphysical qualities. He also has moral qualities that are part of His personality. God greatly desires that we be like Him in our character. Because sin has defiled our being, God made a way that we can change and grow in our character. The book of Psalms describes God.

1. Metaphysical-Incommunicable

Omnipresence. He is everywhere.

Psalm 139:3-10, 23:5; 31:20; 114:7

Omnipotence—19:9-11. He is the Almighty whose powers are infinite.

Omniscience—He is all knowing. God's providence related to His knowledge Ps. 33:13; 92:5, 103:14,139:1; 147:5

Sovereignty—24:1ff. He has supreme authority to do what He wishes without ask ing anyone's permission.

Eternity—90:1-4; 104:31; 145:13. God is immortal and cannot die. Immutability. He is unchanging. Psalm 33:11, Psa. 119:89-91

2. Moral-Communicable
