The Church's Main Job

2 Timothy 2:1-7

Christianity exists in America because the Gospel was entrusted to faithful Christians who taught others to be faithful in teaching others. Because someone in the past cared for us, we were taught the Gospel. If future generations are to hear the Gospel, we must be diligent proclaiming Biblical principles. The future church depends upon us to supply an unbroken chain of faithful teachers. These must be mature people who will not yield to persecution or error.

Paul was thinking of the salvation of future generations when he encouraged Timothy to be strong (2 Tim. 2:1). Timothy was to train others to teach others. These potential teachers would come from the ranks of faithful Christians who had communication skills (v.2). To keep Timothy on this course of action, Paul reminded Timothy of three occupations (vv.4-7).

- 1. A SUFFERING SOLDIER does not let hardships deter him from his service (v.3). Timothy could endure difficulties knowing that Paul was also suffering. Because a soldier's primary goal is the defeat of his enemy, he is careful in his use of time. When we say that we are too busy to teach others, perhaps we have forgotten the One we should be pleasing (v.4).
- 2. A DISCIPLINED ATHLETE knows how to compete according to the rules (v.5). Paul is not describing some "weekend athlete" who occasionally trains, but paints the picture of a professional athlete who cannot drop his training. Timothy is to be a full-time Christian who competes for the souls of men according to God's rules. There is no place for discourtesy even in the heat of debate. We must always be honest, respectful, and humble in teaching our fellow men.
- 3. AN INDUSTRIOUS FARMER will eventually enjoy the fruits of his labors (v. 6) but a lazy one will become bankrupt. Timothy's business was in sowing, not harvesting. We must live it before we can preach it. We plant in hopes that some seed will reach maturity and produce a harvest. We must be the mature example of what we want our hearers to be.

The farmer, soldier, and the athlete are all diligent in pursuit of their goals. Have we been diligent in our pursuit for the souls of men?

Eight Tests for Decision Making

- 1. Scriptural Test—"Has God already spoken about it in His Word?" (2 Timothy 3:16)
- 2. Secrecy Test—"Would it bother me if everyone knew this was my choice?" (Proverbs 11:3)
- 3. Survey Test—"What if everyone followed my example?" (1 Timothy 4:12)
- 4. Spiritual Test— "Am I being people-pressured or Spirit-led?" (Galatians 1:10)
- 5. Stumbling Test—"Could this cause another person to stumble?" (Romans 14:21)
- 6. Serenity Test—"Have I prayed and received peace about this decision?" (Philippians 4:6-7)
- 7. Sanctification Test—"Will this keep me from growing in the character of Christ?" (2 Corinthians 3:18)
- 8. Supreme Test—"Does this glorify God?" (1 Corinthians 10:31)
