Basics of Baptism

Can I share with you what the Bible says about baptism?

Jesus was baptized. He did it because it was the right thing to do—"to fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15). Jesus commissioned His followers to "go make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). The assurance of Jesus is that "whoever believes and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:16). Acts 2, Day of Pentecost, when the Gospel was preached for the first time people asked, "What shall we do?" Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38).

That which is accomplished in baptism is "the forgiveness of your sins" (Acts 2:38). Scripture refers to baptism as both a New Birth and as a Death. As you study the "new birth" of John 3 with the "death" of Romans 6, you see that baptism births a new life out of death. Baptism is that event of faith through which people become children of God (Galatians 3:27).

Some conclusions:

By definition, baptism is an immersion, a burial—not sprinkling or pouring, but submersion, going all the way under if you will. Baptism is a passive event, not an active one. That simply means no one can baptize himself. The person being baptized simply submits to having baptism done to him/her. Someone else has to do the "work." Baptism is Scripture is never done to infants. Baptism is for those capable of repenting, rendering obedient faith, and making a commitment to Jesus Christ. Thus baptism is absolutely necessary for the forgiveness of sins and for membership in the church of our Lord Jesus Christ.

What do you call unbaptized believers?

Not "Christians." A Christian is one who is like Christ. Jesus Christ was baptized. Anyone who refuses baptism is not "like Christ." **Not "members of the church."** Acts 2:47: "The Lord added daily to the church those being saved." That salvation came when they were baptized for the remission of their sins (2:38). Biblically, the only way anyone is added to the church is by being baptized. **Not "saved."** I simply cannot set aside what Jesus said (He that believes and is baptized shall be saved) and pronounce an unbaptized person saved.

Not "children of God." The inspired Paul said," Ye are all children of God by faith in Jesus Christ FOR as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:26-27). Those who have not been baptized have no biblical claim to God's "sonship" that has been created in Christ.

Not "born again." Jesus calls us to a new birth experience (born of water and the spirit—John 3:5) and Paul tells us that one comes forth to new life out of baptism (Romans 6).

I have endeavored to show you Biblical integrity and honesty. If I have missed this goal, please help me know that.


