Honduras Report

I am happy to report that the trip was an awesome success. Thank you for your donation. White Bluff paid for over half of my trip. While in Honduras we saw close to 700 patients total in that one week. Our first day we got there and had a three hour bus drive to our home for the week in Santa Ana. When we arrived we put our stuff down, ate dinner, then automatically started packing food bags for the next day to hand out in the community we were going to. We stayed with a woman named Gayle Davidson. She runs Torch Missions and she has a compound that consists of a big auxiliary building that has a big gym/eating area, bunk rooms, and big community style showers and bathrooms. Our bunk rooms were so nice. On the compound it had that auxiliary building, Santa Ana Church of Christ, a snack shack, three houses, Clinica De Esperanza (Clinic of Hope) and they just started building another auxiliary building that will be identical to the first one. We arrived on Friday evening and packed bags, Saturday we got up at 7, ate breakfast, and went straight to a nearby village and built our first house. Building houses was the most rewarding thing that we did. It was so physically exhausting because we built each house in around 4.5 hours and the average temperature was in the 90s. Sunday we went to the church on the property and then we held a clinic in Ojojona. Monday we held a clinic in another nearby town. Tuesday we split our mission group in half and half of us went to a town far out in the jungle and built a house for an elderly man named Erazmo. The other team went to a house site that was on the side of a cliff and the ground was solid rock, so it made digging the post holes insanely hard, not to mention... We had one power tool, and it was a chainsaw. We did everything by hand except the chainsaw work. We nailed the entire house together board by board. It was a labor of love. The people were so thankful and Erazmo got down on his hands and knees and kissed the floor we made. It was so rewarding. Wednesday we went to Tegucigalpa Teaching Hospital. It was truly an experience. The hospital was in such bad shape, there was no AC. After we toured the hospital I spent about 45 minutes in the NICU holding and feeding babies. It was heartbreaking because a lot of them were hospice because they didn't have the medicine or technology to give them the life saving treatment they needed. We then left the hospital and went to a deaf school. At the deaf school we ate lunch and met all the students and employees. They taught us some of their signing to be able to communicate better. We built them a new basketball court and painted lines of the pavement so they could actually play. Thursday was my class's big day! The junior nursing students ran the clinic to get clinical hours for our pediatric nursing course. We walked to the school in Santa Ana (about a 2 mile hike because they wanted us to see what the kids walk everyday) and on the inside of the main building we had stations set up with equipment. During the clinic our job was to do a full physical assessment on the kids. So we would go to the door, pick up a patient or a family and we would walk through each station and we took vitals (BP, Respirations, O2, Heart rate), hearing tests, vision test, heart and lung assessment, balance/coordination, scoliosis screening, and we wrote them out a full report of their physical health. We charted their height and weight on forms in Spanish so they could keep up with their children's growth and development. The other clinics we did about the same thing except we had three doctors and one physician's assistant prescribing medicine at the end of the assessment and then we had a pharmacist as well running a small pharmacy out of boxes of meds in small baggies that we divided out after dinner most nights during the trip. Friday we held our last clinic. The clinic was a huge success and we also gave 100 families water filtration systems. We had a few men that taught the families all how to use the water filters. Saturday we packed up, said really hard goodbyes, and we got on the road to La Pomerola to fly back to the states. Overall the trip was awesome! I got to use my medical training to help so many people who trusted me and didn't just see me as a novice student. Thank you all so much for supporting all of us going on the trip. We all had a great time. I have about 1000 pictures from the trip. If you want to see the houses we built or know anything about the trip just ask. Thank you all again. I am so blessed to have grown up going to White Bluff.

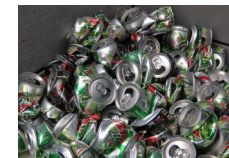
