## **WORDS FROM ETHAN....**

Luke 7:11-17 is a remarkable miracle performed by Jesus. As He is going into the town of Nain, leaving this city is a mother who is suffering great emotional pain as four men carried a lifeless body to be buried. Jesus has compassion for her and commands her son to get up from that bed. So, the son of this mother gets up and life is returned to him. We do not need a miracle like this to happen today to have the response of all the people who watched what Jesus did. If we do not need a miracle to believe, to have faith, or to deepen our relationship with Christ, then we should not demand them. Through the inspired Word of God, we have four accounts all showing us exactly who the Son of God was and is. Our response can be the same as the crowd's response to the miracle of Jesus without physically having been there. The response of the people was to glorify Christ. These people realized in just once instance how awesome Christ was, and yet we have four gospels describing Him to us. How much more should we stand amazed at Christ and be motived for others to see what we have seen?

There is something that each of us as humans can relate to Jesus on: His compassion for this mother. Jesus' character goes on full display as Luke included the minute detail of having compassion. Jesus' compassion leads Him to do things for complete strangers. Strangers who He saw were hurting and were in a very helpless state in life. Even though our world's perception of compassion can be completely off, Jesus shows us exactly how to have compassion for others in our lives.

We can't become too consumed with our own lives that we forget to be Christ-like in being compassionate towards others. Christ exemplified compassion by showing us that we do not have the authority to limit our outpouring of compassion.
