From the Couch

School is Almost Out & Summer is Coming. A couple more days and the 2022-23 school year will be history. Bible Camp begins two weeks from this Sunday (June 11) and Vacation Bible School begins eight weeks from this Sunday (July 16). Many will be taking vacations soon; just be sure to take Jesus with you when you go.

Compassion Card Ministry got off to a great start last Sunday. Thank you for your enthusiastic response. This is a way we can encourage each other, build up the body of Christ, and show love for God's people as well as the lost.

Women Preachers & Elders. According to an online article by Michael Grybosky published on March 7, 2021 in ChristianPost.com, there are seven denominations that permit women preachers: United Church of Christ, Disciples of Christ, Assemblies of God, United Methodist Church (UMC), Presbyterian Church (USA), Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), and the Episcopal Church (https://www.christianpost.com/news/7-christian-denominations-that-allow-women-to-be-ordained.html). Some within our brotherhood are also advocating that women be allowed to preach as well as serve as elders. They claim that Gal. 3:26 shows that men and women have equality in Christ.

While it is true that both genders have equal worth in God's eyes and that we are equal partners in the grace of life (1 Peter 3:7), the Lord gave men and women differing responsibilities in the home and church. Paul told Timothy that women were not to teach over men or have religious authority over men (1 Tim. 2:12-13). The reason was based on the order of creation, not on ever-changing cultural values. Adam was first formed, then Eve. God made Adam first to make a statement about what He expected men to be. He made Eve afterward to make a statement about what He expected women to be.

As our culture becomes more rebellious against God, there will be increasing pressure for church leaders to compromise with the world. Yet those who love God will keep obeying His commandments (John 14:15).

crowned with knowledge

The first step to being crowned with knowledge is <u>understanding</u> that "the way of man is not in himself; it is not in man who walks to direct his own steps" (Jer. 10:23). This means we must be directed down the proper path. Jeremiah understood this and desired to know the proper way, so he sought God's correction and direction. "O Lord, correct me, but with justice; not in Your anger, lest You bring me to nothing" (Jer. 10:24). Through daily Bible study, we begin to understand that not everything which seems right to us is indeed right. "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death" (Proverbs 14:12).

The second step is to give up control of our lives and surrender to God. "A wise man fears and departs from evil, but a fool rages and is self-confident. A quick-tempered man acts foolishly, and a man of wicked intentions is hated. The simple inherit folly, but the prudent are crowned with knowledge" (Proverbs 12:16-18). Paul encouraged Timothy to follow the advice of this proverb. "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim 2:15). When we follow these steps, God will complete us and equip us for every good work. "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16-17). This is where the man of God is crowned with knowledge, because he humbly comes before God to listen and learn from Him. "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matt. 11:28-29).

When we give up control and listen to God, He crowns us with knowledge which builds our faith. "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom. 10:17). And when we study daily, we demonstrate a readiness to listen and build our wisdom (Acts 17:11; James 1:5).
