2. Several miles from his destination Don passed a man walking toward town.
3. Because of the rainstorm Don offered the man a ride.
4. “Do you understand the Bible?” Don asked. “How can I unless someone help me” he replied.
5. The stranger accepted Don’t invitation to attend morning worship service and later on that day was baptized into Christ.
6. At a lake in East Tennessee, Jackie Wright and Randy Cable talked openly about the Lord.
7. A passerby overheard their conversation and asked “I’d like to know the Lord. Could you help me?”
8. Randy looked in the glove compartment for a Bible but could find only a tract entitled “What Must I Do To Be Saved?”
9. After reading the tract the stranger requested baptism.
10. Although the Lord wrote the stranger’s name in His Book of Life, Randy and Jackie were so excited they forgot to ask his name or address.
11. Meanwhile, the stranger went on his way rejoicing.
12. Eighty-five year old Virgie Ellison had studied with Jehovah’s Witnesses, Mormons, and many other groups and knew they were not following The Way.
13. On Sunday evenings in the darkness of her NC home, she listened to various radio broadcasts on WWL-AM in New Orleans, LA.
14. After hearing V.E. Howard’s International Gospel Hour for several weeks, she concluded that he was preaching what she had studied for several years.
15. From her Franklinville, NC home she wrote Bro. Howard for more information.
16. Bro. Howard contacted Ariel Missildine the local preacher in Asheboro, NC and a short time later Virgie Ellison was baptized into Christ.
17. Many little things have been used by the Lord to save a soul: a phone call, a letter of encouragement, a friendly invitation, or a covered dish sent to a sick person.
18. Many other things did the Lord through His disciples which if every one were written, I suppose the world itself would not contain all the books.
