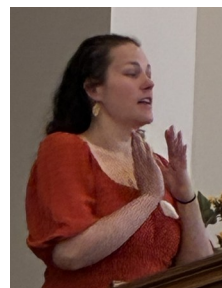
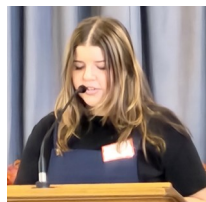

A FULL PARKING LOT

One of our beloved American pastimes is the road trip. The idea of loading up the car with family or friends and taking off on an adventure to explore unfamiliar highways and byways is very appealing. One aspect of the road trip is to find and experience the restaurants, diners, and cafes located in small towns along the way. So, how does one choose the best places to eat while traveling in a new place? Today, we can take out our smart phones and “google” for eateries that have the best reviews and the most stars. But how did we choose a good place to eat in the past before we had the internet? While traveling down the road around lunch time, we looked for a restaurant with a full parking lot. If a café’s lot was overflowing with local cars and utility vehicles, then it was sure to have fine food and good service. Even with the available information today, looking for a full parking lot is still a good method of picking a fine restaurant.

With this methodology in mind, what do people see when they drive by our church building during meeting times? A full parking lot or one with just a few cars randomly scattered about. The church with a parking lot that is filled and running over gives the impression that this is a place where people gather to be filled with spiritual food and enjoy service and fellowship. (Acts 2:42-47) It is a place that people want to come to regularly and consistently to be stirred up with love and good works. (Heb. 10:24-25) The church with a full parking lot is a place where there is community, encouragement and comfort during both good and difficult times.
