What True Repentance Produces

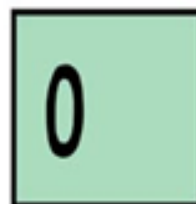

...**diligence** - endurance in doing right
...**clearing** - a clean conscience ...indignation - hatred for sin
...**fear** - respect of God and His word
...**desire** - hunger and thirst for righteousness
...**zeal** - excitement and passion for the Lord
...**vindication** - conquering of evil

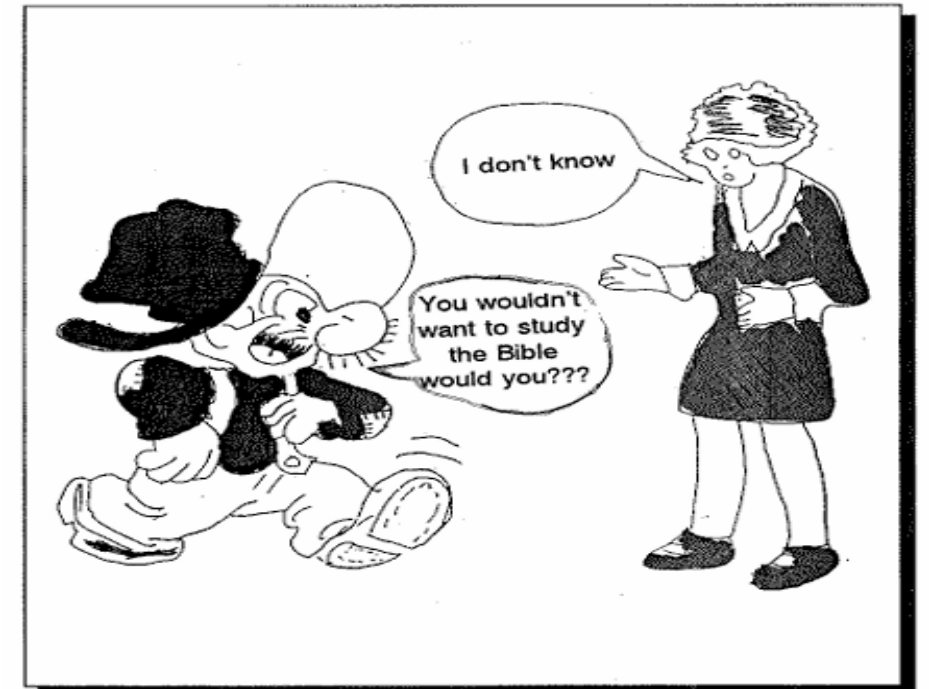

Complete Service to Our Brothers

“Then He poureth water into the basin, and began to wash the disciples’ feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith He was girded” (John 13:5).

There are few incidents in the life of Jesus which so revealed his character and which so perfectly showed his love as the incident in which he washed his disciples’ feet. This was a menial service, especially needed in days when streets were never cleaned and when men wore open-toed sandals. It was a service performed by servants. In this instance there were no servants—and there were no apostles willing to serve. Even though Jesus was only hours away from the climax of his life, and only days away from that great moment when he would return to heaven, he was willing to perform this menial service for his disciples. When he might have had supreme pride, he had supreme humility. The reason is that he loved his disciples.

When we really love people, we too perform the menial tasks which are needed. A mother daily performs the most unappealing of tasks because she loves her family. A father toils at an unpleasant job because he loves his wife and children. When someone we love becomes ill, we delight in doing anything that needs to be done. We discover there is greater joy in serving than in being served.
