A literal Macedonian Call in 2022

Incredibly, the words of Acts 16:9(b) are being reenacted in 2022: “There was a man of I Macedonia standing, beseeching him [Paul], and saying, come over into Macedonia, and help us.”

Most of us have read of how the Polish people have done so much to help their Ukrainian neighbors ever since the war with the Russian government started in February. Less known is the large extent of assistance and resettlement provided for by the countries of Croatia and North Macedonia, both parts of the former nation of Yugoslavia, and now, like Poland, members of NATO, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The public schools, places of lodging, soup kitchens and churches, including the small number of our brethren, are being overwhelmed by this strain, even as they want to help. All of them know about the constant threat posed from the Russians forces to the east, and the older people amongst them have vivid memories of the events of 1968 in what was then Czechoslovakia, and some even of Hungary in 1956, when assistance from the West was restricted to messages of disapproval and formal diplomatic protests of only symbolic help. Their desire is as ours, to help these people who are in a foreign country through no fault of their own for an indeterminate period of time.

Many of these displaced Ukrainians long to study God’s Word in their own language. Many have had to flee without their Bibles, and others lost theirs when the homes were destroyed by Russian shelling or aerial bombing. They need, want and deserve our help. Again, on October 30th, consider prayerfully giving what you can afford to this work, as God has prospered you.
