Psalms & Creation

Psalms has more references to creation than any other book in the Bible: Psalms (70 times), Genesis (47t), Job (41t), Isaiah (35t), Jeremiah (13t), Romans (10t), and Acts (9t).

Consider these examples:

Psalms 8:3,5, 6—"When I consider Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, The moon and the stars, which You have ordained; For You have made him a little lower than the angels, And You have crowned him with glory and honor. You have made him to have dominion over the works of Your hands; You have put all things under his feet."

Psalms 19:1, 4—"The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament shows His handiwork...Their line has gone out through all the earth, And their words to the end of the world. In them He has set a tabernacle for the sun."

Psalms 24:1, 2—"The earth is the Lord's, and all its fullness, The world and those who dwell therein. For He has founded it upon the seas, And established it upon the waters."

Other creation passages include: Psalms 33:6-9, 11; 65:6; 74:16, 17; 78:69; 86:9; 89:11; 89:12, 47; 90:2; 94:9; 95:3-7; 96:5-7; 100:3; 102:18; 102:25; 103:22; 104:2-8, 24, 26, 30; 111:2-5; 119:73, 90-91, 152; 115:15; 121:2; 124:8; 134:3; 136:5-9; 139:13, 16; 146:6; 148:1-6; and 149:2.

These Psalms consistently show that the God of creation is also the God of redemption (see Psalm 111). Moreover, these Psalms show that the God who can create is wise enough to run His universe (see Psalm 89:11-15, 27). He who speaks the heavens and earth into existence is also the judge of unrepentant sinners (Psalm 104:30-25). Thus, God is more than Creator or Redeemer. He is also Judge.

Spend a few minutes this week reflecting upon the size and beauty of creation. Take an early morning or late evening walk. Look at the birds and the flowers and remember how much you mean to God (Matthew 6:25-30).

"For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods. In His hand are the deep places of the earth; the heights of the mountains are His also. The sea is His and He made it; and His hands formed the dry land. Oh come let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD our Maker: for He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand. Today, oh that ye would hear His voice" (Psalm 95:3-7).

This gave the police "probable cause to search the vehicle. They found illegal containers of methamphetamine, GHB, cocaine, fentanyl and MDMA (ecstasy).

Most drug smugglers do not speed. Instead, they carefully follow all traffic laws. And they certainly do not leave in open sight containers of stuff labeled "bag full of drugs." One writer commented about this event: "this is a case of truly stupid criminals."

The truth is, God doesn't need to stumble on bags of dope—appropriately labeled or not. He knows all things. He knows all our sins. Yet, He still forgives us when we truly repent of those short-comings. That's the beauty of God's grace.
