

Rediscover God's Word

Psalms


The Hebrew title for the Psalms is "Songs of Praise." One thing is for sure they contain a great storehouse of words or phrases of praise directed toward God. He is a God of steadfast love, of righteousness, justice, power, creation, lawgiver and many more..

Psalms opens and closes with praise extolling God by using two Hebrew words for God. One is a word that refers to His steadfast love for His people. Our English translation says, "O Lord, our Lord." We miss some of the power and beauty by not knowing the Hebrew words and their meaning.

Psalm 139 is also a powerful Psalm of praise. It tells of an all-seeing, all-present and all-powerful God. To add to the beauty is the fact that such an infinite being is also righteous.

Psalm 23 present the loving, caring, providing and protecting nature of God. We cannot imagine such a being who was wicked. We saw what a very powerful wicked being did to Job. How thankful we can be that God loves and cares for us. It is sad that many do not return love and appreciation to God. Too often we return sinful disobedience to Him and His Word that can and will save the obedient.

Psalm 119 is a most interesting Psalm. There are 176 verses in this Psalm and every verse except maybe one gives praise to God's word. He uses a number of different words referring to God's word such as commandments, law, statutes, testimonies and so on. The Psalmist says of God's word or law that he loves it, it is a lamp to his feet and light to his pathway, he hides it in his heart that he might not sin against God, it is sweeter than honey and more valuable to Him than silver or gold to name a few.



Every verse begins with a letter of the Hebrew alphabet. Since there are only twenty two letters in the alphabet, He divides the psalm into twenty-two groups of eight verses, so the first eight verse begin with their "A" the next eight with their "B" and so on. At least on benefit of this is for memorization purposes. It probably helped locate a particular "verse" or expression in the psalm. At the time of writing, verses were unknown as we have them.


